ENFORCEMENT NOTICE – OPERATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

ISSUED BY: NORTH EAST LINCOLNSHIRE COUNCIL

1. THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE which is issued by the Council because it appears to the Council that there has been a breach of planning control, under section 171A(1)(a) of the above act, at the land described below. The Council considers that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The annex at the end of the notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

2. THE LAND AFFECTED

Land at 212 Willingham Street, Grimsby, North East Lincolnshire shown edged red on the attached plan ("the land")

3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL

Without planning permission the erection and installation of radio antennas shown in green on the attached plan ("the antennas").

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

It appears that the breach of the above planning control has occurred within the last four years.

The retention of the antennas, which are more than 3 metres in height, detract from the character of the residential area. The development thus affects the visual amenity of the area and amenities, which other residents should be allowed to enjoy. The development is thus contrary to Policy GEN1 of the North East Lincolnshire Local Plan Adopted November 2003.

The Council does not consider that planning permission should be given because planning conditions could not overcome these objections.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

Reduce all the antennas at the rear of the above property known as 212 Willingham Street, Grimsby to under 3 metres in height from the ground level.


6. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

28 days after this notice takes effect.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

ANNEX

YOUR RIGHT OF APPEAL

You can appeal against this notice, but any appeal must be received, or posted in time to be received, by the Secretary of State before the date specified in paragraph 7 of this notice. The enclosed booklet "Enforcement Appeals – A Guide to Procedure" sets out your rights. Read it carefully. You may use the enclosed appeal forms. If you decide to appeal, one copy of the form is for you to send to the Secretary of State, together with a copy of the enforcement notice. A spare copy is enclosed for this purpose. The second copy of the appeal form and the notice should be sent to the Council. The other is for you to keep as a duplicate for your own records.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT APPEAL

If you do not appeal against this enforcement notice, it will take effect on the date specified in paragraph 7 of this notice and you must then ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period(s) specified in the notice. Failure to comply with an enforcement notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.
