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Our Vision

North East Lincolnshire Safeguarding Adults Board aims to ensure all citizens live independent lives with their rights and wellbeing protected, in safety, free from abuse and the fear of abuse

We will do this by:

- Demonstrating our commitment to ensuring that Safeguarding is everybody's business
- Establishing a culture that does not tolerate abuse
- Educating professionals and the public on how to spot the signs of abuse and to do something about it
- Work in ways that enable vulnerable adults to make their own decisions and choices
- Ensure the voices of vulnerable people and their carers are heard
- Where possible providing the victims of abuse or neglect with the outcomes that they want, which are right for them
- When abuse happens, provide support to those affected
 - to stop the abuse continuing
 - in order that perpetrators are dealt with properly
 - so access to services is available for those who need them most at the time they are needed



The Care Act 2014

The Care Act 2014 sets out six key principles which

“apply to all sectors and settings including care and support services, further education colleges, commissioning, regulation and provision of health and care services, social work, healthcare, welfare benefits, housing, wider local authority functions and the criminal justice system” (para 14.13).

In North East Lincolnshire we see these as our six principles and everything we do is based on these principles.



Empowerment - People being supported and encouraged to make their own decisions with informed consent.

“I am asked what I want to happen and I am listened to”

Prevention - It is better to take action before harm occurs.

“I am told what abuse is, how to recognise it and how I can protect myself.”

Proportionality - The least intrusive response appropriate to the risk.

“I want professionals to work in my best interest but only get involved as much as needed.”

Protection - Support and representation for those in greatest need.

“I get help and support to report abuse and neglect.”

Partnership - Local solutions through services working with their communities. Communities have a part to play in preventing, detecting and reporting neglect and abuse.

“I know that my local services will protect me and will work together and with me to get the best result for me.”


Accountability - Accountability and transparency in delivering safeguarding.

What we do

The SAB, our safeguarding service and our partners:

- Work towards the prevention of abuse and neglect of vulnerable adults.
- Develop and implement policy and procedures in relation to keeping people safe and promoting the welfare of adults.
- Raise awareness of how this can be done and encourage and support other people to do so.
- Provide learning and development opportunities to people who work or volunteer with vulnerable adults.
- Produce a strategic annual plan stating our vision and objectives and how we will attain them.
- Monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of what we do to safeguard vulnerable adults, including the publication of an annual report that says how well we have done it.
- Participate in and contribute to service planning and commissioning the best services for our vulnerable adults.
- Undertake Safeguarding Adult Reviews when there is serious harm or death of a vulnerable adult and neglect or abuse is suspected.
- Undertake in depth reviews of other cases that we think can help us improve what we do and do better in the future.
- Advise on lessons that can be learned through these reviews and ensure this learning is shared across all relevant agencies.






How we do it

The North East Lincolnshire Safeguarding Adults Board is regulated by law. It decides what needs to be done to realise its vision promoting the six key principles of safeguarding.

Each year we publish a report in which we state what we have done. We also publish a strategic business plan so people know what we intend to do. This year we have published a three year business plan. The plan's objectives are based on the six key principles. These are reviewed and modified continually to keep them current and relevant.

The Board meets regularly to review what has been done, how well it has done and most importantly, the impact. The Board also directs what further work is needed to make sure services are continually improving.

This work is completed by groups and sub-groups who complete the work that needs doing. They are accountable to the Board to ensure this work is done.



SAC

Safeguarding Adults Collection (SAC)

A process to record details about safeguarding activity for adults aged 18 and over in England. The collection includes demographic information about the adults at risk and details of the incidents that have been alleged. Annual statistics are submitted to the Health And Social Care Information Centre.

Safeguarding Adults Return (SAR)

Is a return of information in which is given to the Health And Social Care Information Centre. This will be replaced in future years by the SAC.

Safeguarding Adults Review (SAR)

Is conducted by the Safeguarding Adults Board in cases whereby it is suspected that an adult has experienced serious abuse or neglect.

SAR (in regards to reviews)

Section 42 Enquiry

A safeguarding enquiry where all Section 42 criteria are met as defined by the Care Act 2014.

Section 42 Criteria

Significant Incident Learning Process

The process of facilitating and evaluating a significant incident in adult safeguarding.




