The Council considers that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The annex at the end of the notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

THE LAND AFFECTED

Land at 55 Peterhouse Road, Grimsby, North East Lincolnshire, shown edged red on the attached plan ("the land") marked "A".

3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL

Without planning permission the installation of a metal fence on the front garden of the property as shown marked red on the attached plan marked "B".

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

It appears that the breach of the above planning control has occurred within the last four years.

The property is within a development where permitted rights in respect of development in front gardens have been removed. The retention of the fence would detract from the open plan nature of the whole estate and would thus affect the visual amenity of the area. The proposal is thus contrary to Policy GEN1 and H11 of the North East Lincolnshire Local Plan Adopted November 2003.

The Council does not consider that planning permission should be given because planning conditions could not overcome these objections.
