1. THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE which is issued by the Council because it appears to it that there has been a breach of planning control, under section 171A(1)(a) of the above act, at the land described below. It considers that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The annex at the end of the notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

2. THE LAND AFFECTED

Land to the rear of 45 Alvingham Avenue, Cleethorpes, North East Lincolnshire shown edged red on the attached plan ("the land")

3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL

Without planning permission the incorporation of open space into domestic garden.

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

It appears that the breach of the above planning control has occurred within the last ten years.

The development is an undesirable extension of the residential curtilage.

The development involves non essential development into the open space to the rear of the property. The development has a harmful effect on the character and appearance of the area. Further, the development, if allowed to remain would set an unacceptable precedent, encouraging further proposals to extend residential curtilages into the open space which would further degrade the character and appearance of the area.

The Council do not consider that planning permission should be given because planning conditions could not overcome these objections.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

Remove the fence (shown marked in blue on the attached plan) and cease using the land as an extension to the garden and reinstate the land to its original condition as open space.

6. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

28 days after this notice takes effect.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT
