## **BYELAWS IN RESPECT OF DOGS ON THE SEASHORE AND PROMENADE**

Byelaws made by the Council of North East Lincolnshire Borough Council under Sections 82 and 83 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1907 and Section 235 of the Local Government Act 1972 in respect of the seashore and the promenades.

### **EXTENT**

- 1 (1) Byelaw 3 applies to the beach being an area of the seashore described in Schedule 1 hereafter referred to as “the dog prohibited beach” and to any slope or staircase or accessway leading on to the beach.
- (2) Byelaw 4 applies to all the promenades described in Schedule 2 except those or any part thereof which are for the time being designated under Section 27 of the Road Traffic Act 1988. The Promenades to which Byelaw 4 applies shall be hereafter referred to as “the promenade(s)”.
- (3) Byelaw 4 does not apply in respect of any dogs to which Section 1 of the Dangerous Dogs Act 1991 applies.
- (4) Notice of the effect of these Byelaws shall be given by signs placed in conspicuous positions on the approaches to the dog-prohibited beach and the promenades.

### **INTERPRETATION**

- 2 (1) In the Byelaws “the Council” means the North East Lincolnshire Borough Council.
- (2) For the purpose of these Byelaws the keeper of the dog shall be deemed in charge thereof, unless the dog had been placed in or taken into the charge of some other person at the time when an offence under these Byelaws had been committed.
- (3) In paragraph (2) above “the keeper” shall include the owner of the dog or any person who habitually has it in his possession.

## **DOGS ON THE BEACH**

- 3 Between Good Friday and 30 September inclusive in any year, every person (other than a registered blind person) in charge of a dog who without reasonable excuse permits the dog to enter or remain on the dog-prohibited beach shall be guilty of an offence.

## **DOGS ON LEADS**

- 4 No person in charge of a dog shall, without reasonable excuse, permit the dog to enter or remain on any of the promenades unless the dog is held on a lead and is restrained from behaviour giving reasonable grounds for annoyance.

## **PENALTY**

- 5 Any person offending against Byelaw 3 or 4 shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale.

## **SAVING OF CROWN AND OTHER RIGHTS**

- 6 Nothing contained in any of the foregoing Byelaws shall be deemed to be or shall operate as a grant by or on behalf of the Crown as owner of any part of the foreshore and seabed below high water mark of any estate or interest in or right over any such part of the foreshore and seabed, nor shall anything contained in or done under any of the provisions of the foregoing Byelaws in any respect prejudice or injuriously affect the rights and interests of the Crown in such foreshore and seabed, or prevent the exercise thereon of any public rights or prejudice or injuriously affect any right, power or privilege legally exercisable by any person in, over and in respect of the foreshore and seabed.

## **REVOCATION**

- 7 (1) The Byelaw regarding Prohibition of Dogs on Cleethorpes Beach (part) made by Cleethorpes Borough Council on 3 February 1992 and confirmed by the Secretary of State on 11 May 1992 in respect of part of Cleethorpes Beach is hereby revoked.
- (2) The Byelaw regarding Dogs on Leads made by Cleethorpes Borough Council on the 26 July 1989 and confirmed by the Secretary of State on the 13 September 1989 in respect of the promenades is hereby revoked.

## **SCHEDULE ONE**

The beach referred to in Byelaw 1 ((1) are:

- (a) The seashore between the western extremity of North parade (Wonderland) to a point at the eastern extremity of Cleethorpes Leisure Centre and shown hatched black on the plan which forms part of these Byelaws.

## **SCHEDULE TWO**

### **PROMENADES**

The Promenades referred to in Byelaw 1 (2) are:

- (a) Central Promenade, North Parade and Kings Parade and shown edged with a heavy black line and cross-hatched on the plan which forms part of these Byelaws.
