ENFORCEMENT NOTICE – OPERATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

To: Andrew Mark Glover, 59 Cheapside, Waltham, North East Lincolnshire. DN37 0HE

ISSUED BY: NORTH EAST LINCOLNSHIRE COUNCIL

- 1 **THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE** issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, within paragraph (a) of section 171A(1) of the above Act, at the land described in paragraph 2 of this notice. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Annex at the end of the notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.
2. THE LAND AFFECTED

Land at 59 Cheapside, Waltham, North East Lincolnshire, DN37 0HE shown edged red on the attached plan ("the land")
3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL

3.1 The carrying out of building works prior to Conditions 6, 7, 8 and 9 of planning permission DM/0545/17/FUL having been discharged.
4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

4.1 It appears that the breach of the above planning control has occurred within the last four years.

4.2 There is evidence of contaminants on the site including asbestos. The carrying out of building works prior to the discharge of planning conditions 6, 7 and 8 of planning permission DM/0545/17/FUL makes the building works being undertaken unauthorised.

4.3 It is incumbent on North East Lincolnshire Council, as the Local Planning Authority, to ensure that all Health and Safety risks are, and will be, properly dealt with to ensure that unacceptable risks to human health are safely removed, to best protect the amenity of the land, area and existing and future occupants.

4.4 The continuation of the works prior to the discharge of the conditions as stated in paragraph 3 above is contrary to advice in the National Planning Policy Framework and Policy 2 of the North East Lincolnshire Local Plan 2013-2032 (adopted 2018) in that the continuation of the works presents an unacceptable risk to public safety, the amenity of the land and the enjoyment of the land for existing and future occupants.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

5.1 Cease the carrying out of development, including demolition of buildings, rebuilding, structural alterations of, or additions to, buildings and other operations normally undertaken by a person carrying on business as a builder on the land described in 3 above until such time as conditions 7 and 8 have been discharged.

6. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

One month after this notice takes effect

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This notice takes effect on 13th June 2018 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

ANNEX

YOUR RIGHT OF APPEAL

You can appeal against this enforcement notice, but any appeal must be **received** by the Planning Inspectorate (PINS) (or be posted or electronically communicated at such time that, in the ordinary course of post or transmission, it would be delivered to the Planning Inspectorate) **before** the date specified in paragraph 7 of the notice.

If you want to appeal against this enforcement notice you can do it:

- Online at the Planning Casework Service area of the Planning Portal (www.planningportal.gov.uk/pcs).
- By getting enforcement appeal forms from the Planning Inspectorate on 0303 444 5000 or by e-mailing the Planning Inspectorate at enquiries@pins.gsi.gov.uk.

You MUST make sure that PINS receive your appeal before the effective date on the enforcement notice.

In exceptional circumstances you may give notice of appeal by fax or letter. You should include:

- The name of the local planning authority.
- The site address.
- Your address.
- The effective date of the enforcement notice.

PINS MUST receive this before the effective date on the enforcement notice. This should **immediately** be followed by your completed appeal forms.

Under section 174 of the TCPA 1990 you may appeal on one or more of the following grounds that:

- In respect of any breach of planning control which may be constituted by the matters stated in the notice, planning permission ought to be granted or, as the case may be, the condition or limitation concerned ought to be discharged.
- Those matters have not occurred.
- Those matters (if they have occurred) do not constitute a breach of planning control.
- At the date when the notice was issued, no enforcement action could be taken in respect of any breach of planning control which may be constituted by those matters.
- Copies of the enforcement notice were not served as required by section 172 of the TCPA 1990.
- The steps required by the notice to be taken, or the activities required by the notice to cease, exceed what is necessary to remedy any breach of planning control which may be constituted by those matters or, as the case may be, to remedy any injury to amenity which has been caused by such breach.
- Any period specified in the notice in accordance with section 173(9) of the TCPA 1990 falls short of what should reasonably be allowed.

Not all of these grounds may be relevant to you.

If you appeal under ground (a) of section 174(2) of the TCPA 1990 this is the equivalent of applying for planning permission for the development alleged in the notice and you will have to pay a fee of £116.00. You should pay the fee to North East Lincolnshire Council.

If you decide to appeal, you should state in writing the ground(s) on which you are appealing against the enforcement notice and you should state briefly the facts on which you intend to rely in support of each of those grounds. If you do not do this when you make your appeal the [Secretary of State **OR** National Assembly] will send you a notice requiring you to do so within 14 days.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT APPEAL

If you do not appeal against this enforcement notice, it will take effect on the date specified in paragraph 7 of this notice and you must then ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period(s) specified in the notice. Failure to comply with an enforcement notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.

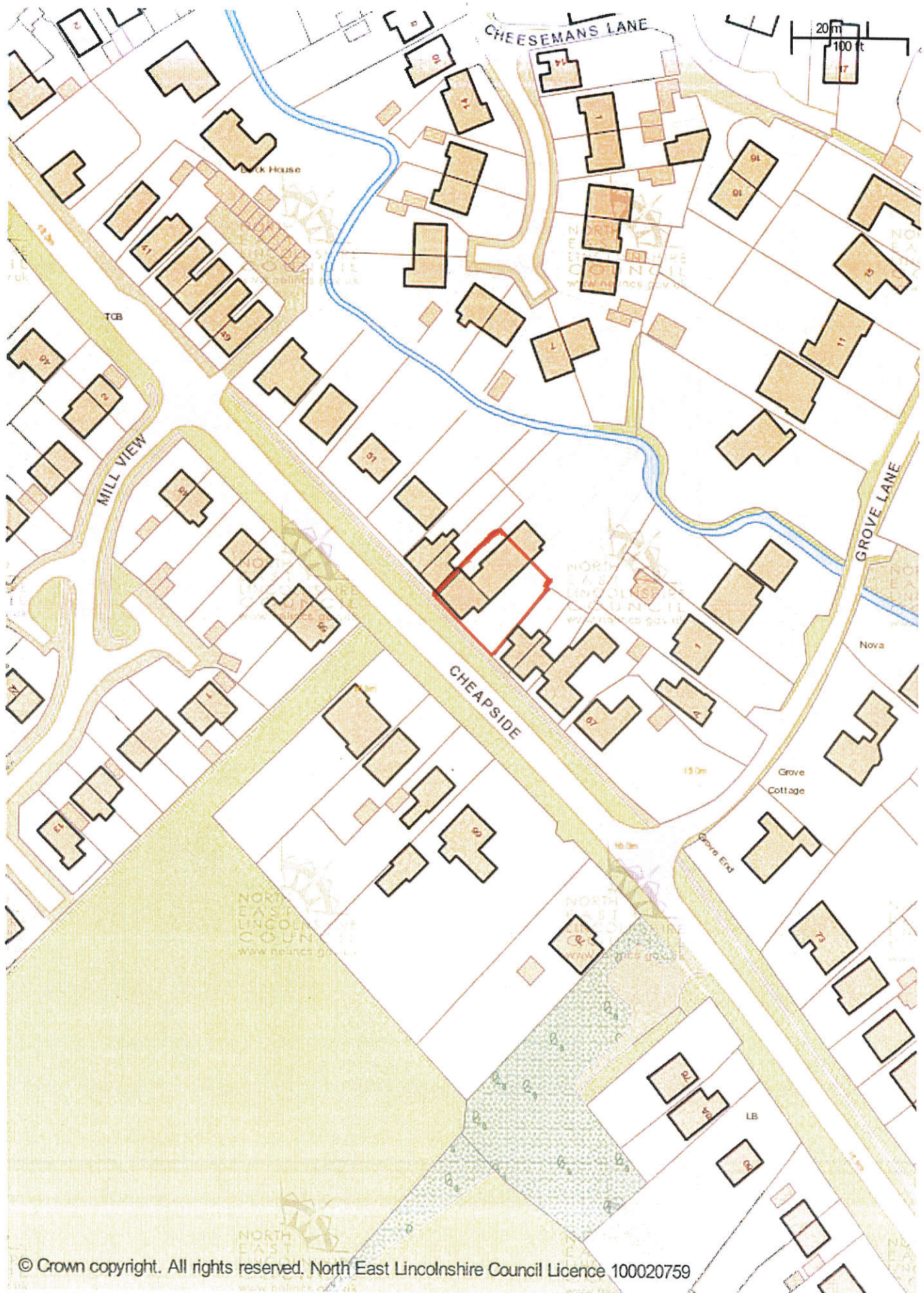
