Young People Support Services (YPSS) have a statutory responsibility to report on the NEET (Not in Education, Employment or Training) and Not Known data for academic Years 12/13. NEET Practitioners are in contact with and have up to date participation status for Year 12-13 young people across the borough and can therefore offer early support in the event that their situation changes. The Team works to promote, support and engage young people into EET (Education, Employment & Training).







• On 30 September we published the scorecard to establish a pre-coronavirus baseline and show how well LAs were tracking young people pre-coronavirus. However, we recognise that COVID-19 means your situation in autumn may be very different to your position in the scorecard (data covers December 2019, January 2020 and February 2020). We know the pandemic is disproportionately impacting young people.

 In response we are suspending our usual performance management activity based on each LA's position on the NEET Scorecard. Instead we will offer support to LAs impacted by the pandemic. We'll look at the monthly NCCIS submissions as they come in. Where there are issues, e.g. high NEET and/or unknowns, we will be in touch to offer support. Affected LAs can expect contact from end-Nov onwards.
