



The Minster, St James House, St James Square, Cartergate and the train station together form another key area of the masterplan. The St James area could provide new spaces for skill development and training, building on existing places like the Grimsby Learning Centre. By building places where people can come to learn new skills and explore new ideas, access to digital tools and meet with others, innovation in Grimsby will flourish, and provide economic opportunities in the town for everyone to benefit from.

Because of the area's great links to roads and the station, in the longer term there might also be opportunities to develop more office space, perhaps nearby the new Cartergate House building, bringing potential new jobs to the town centre. St James Square, which is currently having improvement works done, will be a fun and vibrant square, with lots of cultural and heritage events taking place in it. The square could also provide opportunities for people to eat, drink, and meet up with friends in the evening. Making sure that there are good routes around and through Freshney Place Shopping Centre is also important, linking to the River Freshney on the north side, and to Riverhead Square to the east.
