



Alexandra Dock is a vital part of Grimsby Town Centre. The dock helped put Grimsby on the map in terms of industry, and we think it can do the same again as a place for entertainment, culture and living. The size of the dock, and the amount of under-used land around the dock, means that there is lots of space to try new things, and bring in new uses. Corporation Bridge, which is about to undergo refurbishment, is key to these links and should continue to play a big part in the heritage of the town centre.
