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Troubleshooting tips for hearing aids

- For a child or young person to access speech and succeed in school, it is important that hearing aids are worn and working. Shown below is a table to assist if the hearing aid is not working as normal.
- Hearing aids are on loan from the hospital. It is the responsibility of the family to arrange for repairs to be made if necessary. The ETHV can be contacted for advice. Please ask the family for spare batteries.
- IMPORTANT Batteries (including dead ones) are very dangerous and must be stored safely out of the way of children.

IF THERE IS A PROBLEM WITH THE HEARING AID, CHANGE THE BATTERY - IF PROBLEMS PERSIST USE THE TABLE BELOW:

Hearing aid has no sound

Cause	Possible remedy	
Hearing aid is turned off	Check the hearing aid is turned on by making sure the battery compartment	
	is fully closed	
Wrong size battery	The number showing the battery size should be written in the battery	
	compartment	
Battery is upside down	The battery needs to be plus (+) flat side up. Check for a picture in the aid	
Battery is dead	Replace the battery	
Earmould or tubing is blocked with earwax	Clean ear mould. Use a cleaning tool, a pin or paperclip to dislodge ear wax in	
	tubing. If it is still blocked, contact family or ETHV to have new tubing put in	
Lights are flashing but no sound	Clean ear mould as above. Unscrew hook to see if sound comes through. If	
	still no sound but flashing, contact family or ETHV	
Hearing aid is damaged	Contact family for them to arrange to have the hearing aid repaired	
Hearing aid isn't loud enough		

Cause	Possible remedy
Hearing aids are in the wrong ears	Check the markers on the hearing aids (Red marker Right, bLue marker Left) Let the family know
Tubing has condensation (water bubbles) in it	Blow or shake condensation (water bubbles) out
Ear mould or tubing is blocked with earwax	Clean ear mould. Use a cleaning tool, pin or paperclip to remove earwax from the tubing. If it is still blocked, contact family or ETHV to have new tubing put in
Fault with hearing aid	Contact family for them to arrange to have the hearing aid repaired

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Cause	Possible remedy
Hand and/or clothing are near the ear	Move hand and/or clothing away from the ear
Ear mould is not put in properly	Remove and put back in again - make sure that the top of the ear mould is under the flap of skin at the top of the ear – give it a good wiggle/push
Ear mould is blocked with earwax	Clean ear mould. Use a cleaning tool, pin or paperclip to remove ear wax from the tubing
Ear mould doesn't fit very well e.g. ear mould too small	Contact family for them to arrange to have a new ear mould made
Ear canal is filled with wax (you can't see this)	Contact family for them to arrange for their doctor to check for wax in ear canal.

Sound is distorted or unclear

Cause	Possible remedy	
Hearing aid could be faulty	Contact family for them to arrange to have the hearing aid repaired	
Other problems that could occur		
	Battery door may have a lock. If you know how to unlock it do so. If you are not sure contact family or ETHV (01472) 323465 for advice	

Equipment Information Sheet- a left and right hearing aid with lights and locks

Before reporting a problem with the hearing aid, it is useful to identify the faulty part to ETHV, so that we can provide a quicker fault-finding service
