

THE NORTH EAST LINCOLNSHIRE BOROUGH COUNCIL
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 14(1)
A SECTION OF A1136 FREDERICK WARD WAY, GRIMSBY
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC – TTRO 20-089) ORDER 2020

WHEREAS the North East Lincolnshire Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council"), in exercise of its powers under Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991 hereby make the following Order the effect of which will be that **no person shall cause or permit** any motor vehicle to proceed along the below sections of highway:

- A Section of A1136 FREDERICK WARD WAY – from its junction of A16 PEAKS PARKWAY/VICTORIA STREET SOUTH to its junction with ALEXANDRA ROAD

Alternative route: A1136 FREDERICK WARD WAY, A16 VICTORIA STREET SOUTH, CORPORATION ROAD, BOULEVARD AVENUE, A1136 DUDLEY STREET, A1136 BARGATE, A1136 FREDERICK WARD WAY

This temporary prohibition is required in order to maintain public safety whilst North East Lincolnshire Council safely undertake works to remove high lamp columns from central reservation.

The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply in the interpretation of the Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

The Order shall come into operation on **Monday, 27 July 2020** and shall continue for a period of eighteen months unless extended by Order of the Secretary of State for Transport.

Exemptions to the order will be for authorised vehicles only, as listed below.

- Emergency Vehicles (Fire, Police, Ambulance, Coast Guard)

The Order may be cited as "The North East Lincolnshire Borough Council, Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 – Section 14(1), A Section Of A1136 Frederick Ward Way, Grimsby, (Temporary Prohibition Of Traffic – TTRO 20-089) Order 2020"
