Contract Award: Delivery of Second Access and Spine Roads, Former Western School and Playing Field and relevant cabinet decision on 10<sup>th</sup> July 2019 delegating authority to the Executive Director for Environment, Economy and Resources to enable procurement of the Accelerated Construction Funding.

The Council's Regeneration Partner ENGIE, recently completed a tender exercise to appoint a contractor to deliver the above works.

The Tender was closed and advertised through the existing Highways Framework of Contractors, through the Council's procurement portal Yortender.

There were three responses, which were evaluated for price and quality. The Council and ENGIE jointly evaluated the tenders. Clarification queries were raised and once these were resolved, narrowing down the tenderers to one, offering the best value for money, whilst providing quality. Three other framework providers opted out and decided not to tender for the work.

The tender exercise had oversight from procurement within ENGIE, confirming the process was completed within current Contract Procedure Rules. Full details can be found in the Post Tender Report.

The approach recommended is a framework contract which has the benefits of approved suppliers already meeting certain benchmarks and flagging agreement in advance to appropriate terms and conditions. Further, the Council may achieve better terms by combining its volume with the other public bodies also taking part.

There are further advantages of assurance in that any such framework by necessity must be compliant with Public Contracts Regulations 2015. A framework approach is considered good practice and comes with its own efficiencies.
