#### CONTRIBUTION TO OUR AIMS

Taking steps to reduce the speed limits, on the approach to the Barnoldby le Beck village, will contribute to the health and wellbeing of all road users, business owners, visitors to the area and traffic passing through the authority by creating, and maintaining, a safer environment.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

In support of, and in accompaniment to, the introduction of a roundabout at the A18 Barton Street and Main Road, Barnoldby le Beck junction, a reduction in the speed limit through the junction and on Main Road between the A18 and Barnoldby le Beck from 50mph to 40mph is proposed. It is also proposed to replicate this limit on the eastern approach to the village, currently a national (60mph) speed limit.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that:

- a) Approval be granted to the making of a Speed Limit Order to revoke a section of the current 50mph speed limit on A18 Barton Street as detailed in Schedule 1 in Appendix 1.
- b) Approval be granted to the making of a Speed Limit Order to introduce a permanent 40mph speed limit on the A18 Barton Street as detailed in Schedule 2 in Appendix 1 and as shown indicatively on drawing LTP 20\_02 / 006 to Appendix 2.
- c) Approval be granted to the making of a Speed Limit Order to introduce a permanent 40mph speed limit on the section of Waltham Road, between Barnoldby le Beck and Waltham as detailed in Schedule 2 in Appendix 1 and as shown indicatively on drawing LTP 20\_02 / 008 to Appendix 2.
- d) In the event that there are unresolved material objections to the Order(s), these are referred back to the Portfolio Holder for determination and a decision as to whether or not the Order(s) be confirmed and executed.

## **REASONS FOR DECISION**

To promote appropriate speeds on the approaches to Barnoldby le Beck and Waltham villages to maintain a safe environment for all road users.

#### 1. BACKGROUND AND ISSUES

- 1.1 Works are currently being undertaken on the A18 Barton Street to construct a new roundabout at its junction with Main Road, Barnoldby le Beck as part of the successful £3.8M Safer Roads Fund bid awarded to North East Lincolnshire Council for safety improvements to the A18. To support the introduction of this roundabout, it is proposed to reduce the existing 50mph speed limit on the A18 to 40mph through this junction, the extent of which will also be extended to include the series of bends known as 'Waterdell', where the current advisory 40mph speed limit will be made mandatory.
- 1.2 The 40mph speed limit will be extended to also include the section of Main Road between the A18 and Barnoldby le Beck up to the existing 30mph speed limit, which will remain in place through the village.
- 1.3 To avoid the need to sign multiple changes of speed limit, and reduce sign clutter at this rural location, it is further proposed that the current 50mph limit, existing for a short section (100 metres) of Old Farm Road in the parish of Hatcliffe, be reduced to a 40mph limit.
- 1.4 The section of Waltham Road, between Barnoldby le Beck and Waltham is currently governed by the National Speed Limit which permits a legal maximum speed of 60mph. To maintain a consistent approach regarding speed limits to that of other roads within the Borough of a similar nature, it is also proposed to reduce the speed limit to 40mph on this section.

1.5 Speed surveys were undertaken in September 2020 on Waltham Ro	ad and
Main Road. The survey results are shown below:

\*NPCC Offender Rate – The percentage of motorists travelling at a speed above the National Police Chief's Council (NPCC) recommended enforcement threshold of 10%+2 i.e. for a 30mph, offenders are those travelling at speeds of 35mph and above.

- 1.6 The results of these surveys indicate that a permanent 40mph speed limit is appropriate for these sections of this route and is likely to be accepted by drivers with the mean speed of vehicles being within an acceptable level for a 40mph speed limit.
- 1.7 The Ward Councillors and Parish Councils for both Barnoldby le Beck and Waltham have been consulted on the proposed speed limit changes and have confirmed their support for the proposed 40mph limit for Waltham Road, Barnoldby le Beck and likewise for the proposed 40mph limit on Barton Street and Main Road. However, concern has been expressed that a limit lower than the existing 60mph may not be considered as acceptable by motorists using Waltham Road between the two villages, which in turn may result in a 40mph limit being viewed as inappropriate for this straight section of carriageway. In order to address this concern, consideration is being given to the installation of Vehicle Activated Signs to support the reduced speed limits.
- 1.8 All residents of Barnoldby le Beck together with those in Waltham residing on Barnoldby Road to the west of Bradley Road (a total of 143 properties) have been informed by letter of the proposed changes in speed limits.
- 1.9 Responses have been received from four properties. Three respondents have indicated support for the proposed speed limits with the fourth not believing that any action other than the introduction of average speed cameras would resolve the speeding issues.

## 2. RISKS AND OPPORTUNITIES

## 2.1 Should these proposals be adopted, the opportunities are:

- To create a safe environment for all road users on the A18 through the new roundabout junction.
- To support the existing 30mph speed limit through Barnoldby le Beck and enhance the safety of all road users, acknowledging that this road forms a well-used connection between the A18 and the Grimsby/Cleethorpes conurbation via Waltham.
- A reduced speed limit has the potential to decrease the risk of Personal Injury Collisions occurring, particularly those of a serious or fatal nature.
- Speed limits are supported by Speed Limit Orders enabling enforcement by the Police.
- Create an environment where society feels safer to undertake more healthy behaviours such as increased physical activity in the form of walking and cycling. This, of course provides a wider public health benefit.

## 2.2 Should these proposals not be adopted, the risks are:

• Potential increase in the number of Personal Injury Collisions given the increased volume of motor vehicle vehicles and pedestrians using this route from new developments within the immediate vicinity.

## 3. OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

Do Nothing. This would not provide a signed speed limit commensurate to the design of the new roundabout and traffic attempting to navigate it at the current posted speed for the Barton Street (50mph) may encounter difficulties with an adverse effect on road safety.

## 4. REPUTATION AND COMMUNICATIONS CONSIDERATIONS

- 4.1 Speed limits are issues which can generate conflicting opinions. For this reason, guidance issued by the Department for Transport (DfT) on setting local speed limits has been adopted by the Council as set out in Recommendation 12 of the Regeneration and Scrutiny Panel report on the findings of the Speed Limit/Road Safety Committee January March 2013. This will avoid any allegation that unrealistic speed limits have been set.
- 4.2 It is expected there will be little potential for negative reputational implications for the Council resulting from the decision, as the measures are designed to improve road safety on the A18, Main Road and Waltham Road in the vicinity of Barnoldby le Beck and Waltham villages.
- 4.3 If approval is given to this proposal, the Order will be formally advertised in accordance with the statutory Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996. Public notices will be published in the local press to advise of the Councils intention to make the Order. This provides a formal opportunity for anyone to object to the making of the order.

## 5. FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The recommendation does not require any capital expenditure. Any standard road marking, traffic signing, and public notices required are covered through the Council's Regeneration Partnership arrangement with ENGIE

## 6. CLIMATE CHANGE AND ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

- 6.1 Higher speed is often perceived to bring benefits in terms of shorter travel times for people and goods. However, evidence suggests that when traffic is travelling at constant speeds, even at a lower level, it may result in shorter and more reliable overall journey times, and that journey time savings from higher speed limits are often overestimated.
- 6.2 The proposals are not expected to have any significant impact on climate change and / or the environment. There is the potential that the proposals may encourage more sustainable travel as residents feel safer to make shorter

journeys by other means, whether this be cycling or walking.

## 7. CONSULTATION WITH SCRUTINY

There has been no consultation with Scrutiny in relation to this matter.

#### 8. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

As outlined in section 5, the proposal will not result in additional costs to the Council.

## 9. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 9.1 Under Section 1 Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 traffic authorities are empowered to make Speed Limit Orders for the reasons set out at the beginning of this report.
- 9.2 The procedure for making Orders is set out in Schedule 9 Part III of the 1984 Act and the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 and provides for advertisement and consideration of any objections before making a final decision on the proposed Order(s).
- 9.3 Regulation 8 makes provision for objections and regulation 14 allows the Council to modify an Order before it is made.
- 9.4If it is decided to make the Order notwithstanding any objections, once made the order can only be challenged by Judicial Review in the Administrative Court.

#### **10. HUMAN RESOURCES IMPLICATIONS**

There are no direct human resources implications arising directly from this report.

## **11.WARD IMPLICATIONS**

The proposals relate to issues solely within the Wolds Ward but also impacts to issues on the boundary of the Waltham Ward
