**1. Subject and details of the matter** (to include reasons for the decision and detail of any previous cabinet decision)

Urgent Contract Award: Delivery of the Access and Spine Roads, Former Matthew Humberstone School Playing Field and relevant cabinet decision on the 10 March 2021, delegating authority to the Executive Director for Environment, Economy and Resources in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Economic Development, Housing and Tourism to enable procurement of the Accelerated Construction Funding.

The Councils regeneration Partner EQUANS recently completed a tender exercise to appoint a contractor to deliver the above works.

The Tender was closed and advertised through the existing Highways Framework of Contractors, through the Councils procurement portal Yortender.

Only one contractor submitted a response through the framework. This tender underwent a price and quality evaluation. Clarification queries were raised and once these were resolved, it was agreed that the tender provided offered the best value for money, whilst providing quality. All other framework providers opted out and decided not to tender for the works.

The contract award is urgent to ensure the Council meets its Grant Funding obligations. The project has slippage due to delays in submitting a planning application whilst discussions

were on going with the CCG to agree the location of the Extra Care facility. This has caused delays to the programme which needs to be completed by the 31 March 2022.

That the Executive Director for Environment, Economy and Resources in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Economic Development, Housing and Tourism award the tender to the successful bidder

Other options included providing an open tender, however this was rejected as there would be a risk to quality as all framework contractors have been assessed for quality, before being accepted on to the framework.

Self-delivery is not an option as neither NELC nor EQUANS have adequate resource and experience to delivery these works on time, and within budget.
