4/16	<p>Fairer Funding Formula for Schools 2016-17 Update</p> <p><i>The purpose of this note is to update and advise Schools Forum members of the impact of the APT October 2015 submission following receipt of the October 2015 Schools Census data. This data formed the basis of the FINAL APT submitted to the EFA by the 20th January 2016 which determine the 2016-17 Schools Funding Formula to be allocated to schools through the school block formula.</i></p> <p>It had been agreed at the last Schools Forum meeting that the SF Working Party would meet on the 8th January to look at any changes and agree the final submission – details of changes are highlighted in the attached document.</p> <p>Action: DK to present the EFA Report analysing how LA’s have implemented their Local Formulas at a future Forum</p> <p>Recommendation That Schools Forum confirm support for the final adjustments made – this was agreed.</p>	DK
5/16	<p>DfE Consultations – Schools National Funding Formula (Stage 1) & High Needs Funding Formula & other Reforms (Stage 1)</p> <p><i>These consultations are the first of a two stage process. The deadline for the responses for both the consultation documents is the 17th April 2016.</i></p> <p>Action: Email to be sent to all headteachers/principals asking for any comments they would like to be considered to be sent to DK by the 14th April</p> <p>A working party to be set up, to include, GK, CS, KL, AM, LW & RD, WJ</p> <p>Action: Working Party to meet on the 14th April at 2pm</p> <p>GK thanked DK and AA for all the time they have dedicated to this.</p>	KS
6/16	<p>SEN Working Party Update – Primary BACs</p> <p><i>A SEN Funding Working Group has been set up to look at options – this paper highlights what they looked at.</i></p> <p>GK commented that we may want to take another look at the Formula as to whether schools giving children another chance</p>	

	<p>should be given support. PC reported that we are supporting the pilot project to encourage schools to work in a restorative way, money may be available from the Government to support this.</p> <p>Recommendations</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Schools Forum agree to increase the number of primary alternative provision places from 30 to 36 at an additional cost to the High Needs Block of £101,000 per annum. 2. Schools Forum approve the introduction of a charging process when schools are over their notional places and when all commissioned places have been used. This is in line with the process in place in relation to secondary BAC places. <p>Members voted unanimously to support the above.</p>	
<p>7/16</p>	<p>SEN – High Needs Block Allocation 2016-17 <i>The purpose of this paper is to advise Schools Forum members of the proposed allocation of the High Needs Block (HNB) for 2016-17 and seek any comments they may have.</i></p> <p>LP commented that the SEN Early Years allocation has gone down significantly. DK updated that the spend has not come through, so the spend has been adjusted accordingly, this figure can be amended to reflect this. LP – this is taking time to come through so an increase may occur DK – work has been done and it seems reasonable at this time, will come back to Forum if there is pressure on this amount. AZ queried how much has been spent to date DK reported a projected spend of around £30k so has doubled the figure to £60k to cover the rest of the year.</p> <p>Recommendation It is recommended that Schools Forum note the report.</p> <p>Noted</p>

<p>9/16</p>	<p>Falling Roles Fund and Growth Fund Contingencies</p> <p><i>The purpose of this report is to recommend, subject to any comments Schools Forum may have, an amendment to one of the eligibility criteria of the above procedures to be applied in assessing whether a school applying to access such funding meets the eligibility criteria.</i></p> <p>The criteria as it is currently worded allows for a great deal of subjectivity which it is felt could be subject to challenge. Officers propose therefore that as a general guide where reserves are in excess of say 10% then this sum should be offset the requested or calculated sum.</p> <p>Recommendation</p> <p>We would request Schools Forum to approve the above amendment to one of the eligibility criteria for both the falling rolls fund and the growth fund.</p> <p>Members voted unanimously to support the above.</p>
