PH.EE.24 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no declarations of interests in respect of items on the agenda.

PH.EE.25 PETITION – PARKING CONDITIONS ON BOLINGBROKE ROAD, CLEETHORPES

The Portfolio Holder received a petition regarding the parking conditions on Bolingbroke Road, Cleethorpes.

The Portfolio Holder invited Councillor Brookes to introduce the petition.

Councillor Brookes declared a personal interest as he lived on the road in question, but stated that the area the petition related to was away from his property. He passed around pictures of Bolingbroke Road to emphasise the problems residents were facing, including the problems they face during the evening. Councillor Brookes explained that there had been counter arguments to the petition from residents further down Bolingbroke Road as they were worried that if this part of Bolingbroke Road in question was to receive parking restrictions, the problems would shift further down the road to them. Councillor Brookes stated that he was here to present both sides of the argument and had told residents that, subject to the Portfolio Holders decision, this would go through the formal petition process and the best outcome for all residents would be put forward.

RESOLVED – That the petition be received and progress be reported through the tracking report at future meetings of this Portfolio Holder.

PH.EE.26 NELC LOCAL TRANSPORT PLAN – QUARTER 2 MEMBERS UPDATE

PH.EE.29 TRACKING REPORT

RESOLVED -

- (1) That in relation to DNPH.ET.16 (Petition for pedestrian crossing, Station Road, Stallingborough), a feasibility study was still being undertaken. This item to remain on tracking until a resolution had been accomplished.
- (2) That in relation to DPH.EE.6 (Petition for the maintenance schedule for public grassed areas in Cleethorpes), it be noted that the issues raised by the lead petitioner were to be discussed at the Smarter Neighbourhood Working Group on the 11th December 2017.
- (3) That in relation to DNPH.EE.10 (Petition to lock gates at Cleethorpes Country Park), this matter now be closed as it was noted that in relation to issues raised by the lead petitioner of anti-social behaviour, Humberside Police did not perceive Humberston Country Park to be an area of concern. In addition, , due to limited resources within Neighbourhood Services, it would not be possible to lock the gates at Cleethorpes Country Park.
- (4) That in relation to DNPH.EE.15 (Petition for the site clearance and demolition of Cherry Valley Building, Pelham Road) this matter now be closed as it was noted that the lead petitioner had been updated on the current state of the site and made aware that remedial action needed to take place to prevent further access to the site in question.
