## HIGH NEEDS NATIONAL FUNDING FORMULA AND OTHER REFORMS – CONSULTATION STAGE 2

## Key Points

- 1,075 responses to the Stage 1 consultation.
- No LA will lose out in funding.
- LA's to continue to receive HN's DSG.
- Gains of up to 3% for the next 2 years for those that are underfunded.
- With agreement of Schools Forum and the majority of maintained / academies primary / secondary schools LA's will be able to deploy some funding for schools for high needs purposes.
- Allocations based on 2005 2006 spending patterns.
- 7 principles proposed in Stage 1:
  - Support Opportunity
  - o Be Fair
  - Be efficient
  - o Get funding to the frontline
  - o Be transparent
  - Be simple
  - Be predictable
- Proxy measures to be used as an assessment of need.
- Factors to be used
  - Population 2 18
  - Low Attainment
  - Health and Disability
  - Deprivation
  - A basic per pupil entitlement
  - Plus an Area Cost Adjustment (Hybrid method)
- Resource Base Provision a new method of funding is proposed, we might need to look how we deal with this provision.
- Funding of Independent Special Schools Stage 1 proposed moving to "per place" and "top up" system. This has been removed and funding approach will remain the same.

- LA's due to gain will get the increase in full by 2018-19. In the Y & H region 13 out of 15 LA's will gain.

- Special Schools no changes to the current funding mechanism proposed.
- AP Funding Schools to have more responsibility in future for commissioning AP that is required for their pupils to be accompanied by accountability for pupils educational attainment while they are in AP.
- Changes to SEN and disability funding for Colleges / other FE Institutions two suggested changes proposed during the Phase 1 consultation around the level of the "per place" funding to be put on hold.

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
