This document is 'work in progress'; the updating of the work programme is an ongoing task. The work programme in detail describes the panel's desired outcomes, objectives, intentions, outputs and progress. Topics may be added or withdrawn to react to changing priorities.

2. Terms of reference

The scrutiny panels are responsible for scrutinising any matters affecting North East Lincolnshire within their remit. For the Tourism and Visitor Economy Scrutiny Panel these include:

- Tourism
- Visitor economy and retail offer
- Libraries, museums and culture
- Local heritage
- Leisure and sport
- Beach safety



3. Scrutiny of the budget

A key element of the work programme is annual scrutiny of the Council's proposed priorities and budget prior to formal approval by Cabinet and Council in February 2023. This is usually achieved via both informal and formal all Member budget scrutiny meetings.

The Executive and Scrutiny Liaison Board will determine how budget scrutiny, performance monitoring issues and matters of a corporate nature which affect the Council as a whole, are dealt with.

4. The Council Plan
