DN.HWBB.01 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Dr Melton declared a personal interest in agenda item 8 the Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment update because there is a dispensing pharmacy within his GP practice.

DN.HWBB.02 BETTER CARE FUND

The Board considered a report on the requirements for the quarter four/end of year return for 2021/22 Better Care Fund (BCF).

RESOLVED – That the end of year/ quarter four reporting submission, 2021/22 (that was submitted via the delegated authority of the then portfolio holder, Councillor Cracknell) be approved.

REASONS FOR DECISION – Councillor Cracknell, with the support of the BCF steering group, oversaw BCF activity and ensured national reporting compliance on behalf of the Board for the period 2021/22.
