SUBJECT Review of Play Areas Update

STATUS Open

CONTRIBUTION TO OUR AIMS

The work on the play areas will ensure that there are good quality play areas for children in North East Lincolnshire. This work links to the priorities of the Outcomes Framework, particularly *Benefit from green economy and a high quality environment* and *Enjoy good health and wellbeing*. This, in turn, links to the Council's *Environment* priority, as the project supports the work to *maintain our parks and open spaces for everyone to enjoy*.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report outlines the programme of work that will be undertaken in play areas over the next two years.

MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION

The Panel has requested an update on progress with the Play Areas project and suggested its inclusion in the Panel's work programme.

1. BACKGROUND AND ISSUES

- 1.1 Over ten years ago, the Council received funding from Play Builder to refurbish and install play equipment across North East Lincolnshire. Over the years, the play equipment has gradually deteriorated and work now needs to be undertaken to bring the play areas up to an improved standard.
- 1.2 Cabinet received a report on playground improvements at their meeting on 16 June 2021 and approved the release of capital funding (£800,000) for this work.
- 1.3 A project team was established to deliver the project.
- 1.4 Consultation and engagement has been undertaken with ward councillors to agree an implementation plan and allocation of equipment across play areas.
- 1.5 In order to ensure that Public Contract Regulations and Contract Procedure Rules were followed, a procurement exercise was undertaken during December 2022 and January 2023. This procurement consisted of three lots:
 - Lot One New and replacement equipment and surfacing
 - Lot Two Spares and parts to supply the Parks Team
 - Lot Three Schedule of works for repair
- 1.6 The procurement exercise has now closed and the process is at the contract award stage.

- 1.7 The most pressing work that needs to be undertaken is that contained in Lot Three (Schedule of works for repair), as this is the schedule of RoSPA (The Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents) repairs and will cost approximately £200,000 to undertake. This work covers twenty-three play areas:
 - 1. Ainslie Street
 - 2. Albion Street
 - 3. Alden Close
 - 4. Butt Lane
 - 5. Capes Recreation Ground
 - 6. Carver Road
 - 7. Duke of York Gardens
 - 8. Grant Thorold Park
 - 9. Haverstoe Park
 - 10. Kingston Gardens
 - 11. Mount Pleasant
 - 12. Musical Garden, King's Road
 - 13. Neville Turner Way
 - 14. Nunsthorpe Recreation Ground
 - 15. Quantock Park
 - 16. Rose & Crown
 - 17. Sidney Park
 - 18. Sixhills Street
 - 19. St Christopher's Playing Field
 - 20. Sussex Recreation Ground
 - 21. Sutherland Park
 - 22. Weelsby Woods
 - 23. Wingate Parade
- 1.8 The total capital spend for this project is £800,000, less what will be spent on the RoSPA repairs (£200,000) and the money already spent on work (£37,115), leaving a balance of £562,885. Based on this figure, along with a 10% contingency, it is expected all wards will receive an update on most of their play areas. Please see the attached appendix for details.
- 1.9 Once the contracts have been awarded, a programme of works will be created and shared with ward members.
- 1.10 As the work progresses, if any flexibility over the scheduling and prioritising of the work arises, consultation will be undertaken with members.

2. RISKS AND OPPORTUNITIES

If there is not this investment in play areas, there is a risk that the Council will be left without suitable play areas for the local community and visitors.

The investment in the play areas will provide an opportunity to prevent play equipment deteriorating further and help reduce maintenance and potential health and safety liabilities to the Council in the future.

3. REPUTATION AND COMMUNICATIONS CONSIDERATIONS

The investment in the play areas will ensure that there is a positive reputational benefit to the Council, as it will be supporting the commitment to having a high-quality green space, which will benefit children of all ages and ability. Work will be undertaken with the Communication's Team on how best to promote the improvements that are being made.

4. FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The Cabinet meeting on 16 June 2021 approved the release of £800,000 capital funding to commence a procurement exercise for the play area equipment, installation, repairs and maintenance arrangements.

5. CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE IMPLICATIONS

This investment in play areas will ensure that children of all abilities and age ranges have access to good quality local play space, which will contribute to their health and wellbeing.

6. CLIMATE CHANGE AND ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

The improvement of the green space in North East Lincolnshire will make a positive contribution to the Council's commitment on climate change and the environment.

7. MONITORING COMMENTS

In the opinion of the author, this report does not contain recommended changes to policy or resources (people, finance or physical assets). As a result, no monitoring comments have been sought from the Council's Monitoring Officer (Chief Legal Officer), Section 151 Officer (Director of Finance) or Strategic Workforce Lead.




