DEDICATED SCHOOLS GRANT FINANCIAL SETTLEMENT 2021-22

1. Purpose

The purpose of this paper is to provide school forum members with an update on the 2021-22 financial settlement in respect of the Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) which was published by central government on the 17th December 2020.

2. <u>Settlement position</u>

The settlement issued on the 17^{th} December 2020 and detailed data issued in respect of the Council indicates a total DSG figure (before recoupment) of £151.436M for 2021-22. This is an increase of £11.850M on the 2020-21 figure of £139.586M.

The DSG allocation has increased by £11.850M. The increase is as a result of the introduction of the new High Needs Block National Funding Formula, increased pupil numbers in schools and the additional funding pledged to schools. This increase has been offset by a reduction in early funding for reasons explained above.

Please note, the figures quoted above are before any academy recoupment and as in previous years, the allocation for the Early Years block is illustrative and will be adjusted in the July of the following financial year based upon the January 2021 and January 2022 head counts. In respect of early years in particular funding has been influenced by the on-going COVID 19 pandemic and at this point it is not possible to state if this will be subject to further changes.
