SCHOOLS FORUM MEETING – 13TH JANUARY 2021 FUNDING FORMULA FOR SCHOOLS 2021-22 UPDATE

1. Introduction

On the 17th December 2020 the Department for Education (DfE) issued the final funding allocations for the 2021-22 financial year together with a revised APT updated for the October 2020 School census data.

The purpose of this report is to update Schools Forum members on the effect of the updated data, the re-modelling undertaken and the final proposed funding formula for 2021-22 prior to submission of the proforma to the DfE.

2. Impact of the Changes

The updated School Census data shows a net increase in pupil numbers of 155. This is split as follows:

Within individual schools however there have been significant movements. These are detailed blow for each phase:

The impact of the net pupil number increases and the other updated data plus the confirmation of the growth factor gives a final allocation for the Schools Block of £115.954m. When the initial modelling work was undertaken this was based on £112.414m. This didn't include a calculation for growth. There is therefore an additional amount of £3,540m to allocate predominantly as a result of the updated October 2020 census data and growth.

As a consequence of the above it has been necessary to refine the funding formula to ensure full allocation of the Schools Block. Such refinement needed to be aware of the National Funding formula (NFF) values and changes to these and the DfE views around the Primary: Secondary ratio of it being around the parameters of 1:1.28.

3. Modelling changes proposed

In the initial modelling shared with the Schools Forum and the schools during the consultation process all NFF values had been used with the exception of the following:

No specific feedback was received in respect of the consultation and these comments received were more of a general nature.

On receipt of the final schools block allocation and updated proforma then further refinement Is necessary. Given that other than the above all other factor values are at the NFF then the proposal is to amend the AWPU's as follows:

Whilst the above moves the KS3 factor away from the NFF value this is considered necessary to prevent the other two factors values becoming significantly different from the NFF values.

4. Submitted Final Funding Formula 2021-22

If the changes highlighted above are accepted, then the 2021-22 Schools funding formula will:

Adopt the NFF and its unit values except for the below:

- Increase the previous year's 2020-21 AWPU values
- Slightly increases the Primary:Secondary ratio to 1:1.29 (2020-21 was 1:1.28) which DfE expect the figure to be around.
- Has additional funding for 6 primary schools and 2 secondary schools in order to meet the minimum funding levels (£305k).
- MFG + 2.00% compared to + 1.84% in 2020-21. As a result schools that gain will be allowed to keep all of these.
- Has a MFG cost of £367k protecting 14 primary schools and 4 secondary schools.
- 5 primary schools will be worse off in cash terms compared to 2020-21.
 All of these schools have lost pupil numbers. The largest reduction is £12k

- Puts 75.68% of the funding through Basic pupil factors Age Weighted Pupil Factors (AWPU). This was 75.00% in 2020-21.
- Puts 93.32% of the funding through Pupil led factors Age Weighted Pupil Factors (AWPU), deprivation, prior attainment etc. This was 93.16% in 2020-21.
- Allocates 100% of the schools block. See below:

The rates position for 2021-22 is still to be finalised so a working assumption of a 3% increase on financial year 2020-21 actuals has been factored into the above. All schools however are funded based upon actual cost, in the case of academies an on line application to the ESFA is required.

The formula submission needs to be forwarded to the DfE by their deadline of 21st January 2021.

5. Recommendation

It is requested that Schools Forum ratify the report and the decisions taken by officers in respect of the final schools funding formula proposed for 2021-22.
