Not applicable due to the short notice from Central Government in respect of this funding - notice of the funding was not received until 8th August 2022, the first payment is to be made in quarter 2 (July – September) and therefore the return for the signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is as soon as possible.

2. Subject and details of the matter (to include reasons for the decision)

Local Government Act 2003: Section 31 local authority grant for Individual Placement and Support (IPS) 2022-20252022-2023 - £115,000 (2022/23) - An indicative allocation of up to £147,000 for 23/24 and £148,395 for 24/25 has been allocated, subject to annual confirmation from HM Treasury.

The allocated funding is to provide:

- The Project concerns the delivery of the Individual Placement and Support (IPS) employment support approach for people receiving structured community treatment for drug and alcohol dependence who are either unemployed or are employed but at risk of unemployment, conducted in several local authority areas.
- IPS is intensive employment support delivered by trained employment specialists and provided as part of multi-disciplinary clinical services, rather than separately through mainstream employment support services.

 The IPS Project is managed by the Addiction & Inclusion Directorate at the Office for Health Improvement & Disparities (OHID), funded by OHID for Work and Pensions. Funding is being provided to the IPS areas for the purposes of employing the IPS employment specialists.

3. Decision being taken

- 1. That authority be delegated to the Director of Public Health in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Heath, Well Being and Adult Social Care to accept the funding from the Office of Health and Disparities (OHID) on behalf of the Council
- That authority be delegated to the Assistant Director Law, Governance and Assets to complete and execute all requisite legal documentation in relation to the matters outlined above.

Yes – Confirmation of the funding was not received until 8th August 2022 and the return date for the signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is as soon as possible.

5. Anticipated outcome(s)/benefits

The allocated funding is to enable the commissioned provider We Are With You (WAWY) in North East Lincolnshire and North Lincolnshire to work with anyone of working age engaged in structured alcohol and drug treatment. IPS is highly personalised, features significant employer engagement, and offers in-work support in addition to pre-employment support. IPS is a 'work first' intervention designed to support people into jobs that they want to do regardless of their stage on the recovery journey. It is also, to a large extent, a work only intervention - the aim is to support people in paid, mainstream jobs.

The alternative is not to sign the MOU resulting in the loss of funding and subsequently not being able to deliver IPS in North East Lincolnshire and North Lincolnshire.

On the 4th August the Council received notification that it had been awarded £115,000 in 2022-23 with indictive allocations of up to £147,000 in 2023-24 and £148,395 in 2024-35 in respect of the delivery of the Individual Placement and Support (IPS) employment programme. The funding is to be received via a S31 unringfenced grant. The grant comes with conditions attached the principal ones being that the new funding is used for add to existing services, provide complementary services or offer new services.
