Award of the contract(s) for the Provision of Insurance Coverage and Associated Services (Excluding Insurance Broker Services) for North East Lincolnshire Council

On the 16th February 2022 Cabinet resolved that (DN. 121 Procurement of Insurance Services):

1. Approves the commencement of a procurement exercise for the Insurance Services.

2. Delegates responsibility to the Executive Director of Environment, Economy and Resources in consultation with the Deputy Leader and Portfolio Holder for Finance, Resources and Assets to deal with all matters leading to and including the award of the contract(s) for the Insurance Services.

3. Authorises the Assistant Director Law, Governance and Assets (Monitoring Officer) to complete and execute all legal documentation in connection with the award.

2. Subject and details of the matter (to include reasons for the decision)

Approval to award the contracts for the provision of Insurance Coverage and Associated Services (Excluding Insurance Broker Services) for North East Lincolnshire Council. The maximum duration of the contracts is 60 months.

The Council's insurance requirements were split into the following lots:

Lot 1 - Property Combined

- Lot 2 Computers
- Lot 3 Casualty
- Lot 4 Crime
- Lot 5 Motor Fleet
- Lot 6 Engineering Services
- Lot 7 Fine Art

A further competition was run via the YPO Dynamic Purchasing System Tender for The Provision of Insurance Placement (978).

Following conclusion of the evaluation process the following tenderers identified in section 3 Decision Being taken have been identified as the most economically advantageous tenderers and approval is sought to award the relevant contracts to them.

Lot 7 – Fine Art - Recommendation is to not award because no compliant submissions were received. A separate procurement process for this insurance will be run in line with the Contract Procedure Rules.

3. Decision being taken

That the Executive Director for Environment, Economy and Resources in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Finance, Resources and Assets approves award of the contracts for the Insurance Coverage and Associated Services

(Excluding Insurance Broker Services) for North East Lincolnshire Council to the following providers for a maximum 60 months:

Lot 1 - Property Combined - Risk Management Partners Limited

Lot 2 – Computers - Risk Management Partners Limited

Lot 3 – Casualty - Zurich Municipal

Lot 4 – Crime - Risk Management Partners Limited

Lot 5 - Motor Fleet - Zurich Municipal

Lot 6 - Engineering Services - Zurich Municipal

That the Executive Director for Environment, Economy and Resources in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Finance, Resources and Assets approves the non-award of the Lot 7 – Fine Art – and for a separate procurement process to be run in line with the Contract Procedure Rules for Fine Arts insurance.
