THE NORTH EAST LINCOLNSHIRE BOROUGH COUNCIL ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 14(1)(a) <u>MENDIP AVENUE, GRIMSBY</u> (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC– TTRO 23-010) ORDER 2023

WHEREAS the North East Lincolnshire Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council"), in exercise of its powers under Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991 hereby make the following Order the effect of which will be that **no person shall cause or permit** any motor vehicle, pedestrian or pedal cycle from **PROCEEDING** along on the below sections of highway:

• A section of MENDIP AVENUE– Part length from the junction of SPRINGFIELD ROAD heading in a southerly direction to the junction of QUANTOCK ROAD 400 metres Alternative route: Mendip Avenue, Waltham Road, Springfield Road (Reverse Route Applies)

This temporary prohibition is required because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the road by Equans. These works are detailed as setting out prior to carriageway resurfacing works.

The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply in the interpretation of the Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

The Order shall come into operation on **Monday**, **24 July 2023** and shall continue for a period of eighteen months unless extended by Order of the Secretary of State for Transport.

Exemptions to the order will be for authorised vehicles only, as listed below. •

- Liveried Local Authority Vehicles (EQUANS / NELC)
- Emergency Vehicles (Fire, Police, Ambulance, Coast Guard)
- Authorised Contractors / Utilities / Waste
