1. Cabinet date and copy resolution this key decision relates to

Cabinet on the 9^{th of} March 2022

That authority be delegated to the Executive Director for People, Health and Care in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Children and Education to:

1. Approve the continuing rolling program of identified highest priority condition works within the Schools Capital Maintenance Program.

2. Approve the program of new pupil places schemes to ensure that the Local Authority has sufficient and suitable school places to meet its statutory responsibility in accordance with the Education Act and the demand for local places due to new housing developments. This program includes the need for two new 210 place primary schools, as well as expanding some of the Local Authority's existing sites by the creation of a further 150 pupil places at Cleethorpes Academy, and 245 pupil places across Laceby and New Waltham schools.

3. Approve the program of works within the High Need Program.

4. Commence procurement exercises where necessary in connection with the above, and to appoint suitable providers to run two new proposed 210 place primary schools to include award, mobilisation and implementation at the appropriate time.

5. To carry out all ancillary activity reasonably arising from the above.

6. That the Assistant Director Law, Governance and Assets be authorised to execute any documentation arising from the above recommendations.

2. Subject and details of the matter (to include reasons for the decision)

Approval is sought to award a contract for the following works at Cleethorpes Academy, School expansion, to Topcon Ltd.

An indicated cost of £2m was allocated for increasing the capacity of Cleethorpes

Academy from the school's capital programme funding, sufficiency of school places.

This is the second phase of the project the tender has come back within budget at

£1,251,941.87 with associated fees, direct costs, legislative consents and

contingency costs at £1,539,888.50.

3. Decision being taken

That the Director for Children's Services in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Children and Education awards the contract for the expansion and remodelling of the site at Cleethorpes Academy.

Cabinet on the 9th March 2022 approved the Schools Capital Programme for 2022 and beyond. The cabinet report gave a detailed breakdown of schemes and budget allocations attributed to each scheme. The scheme identified for Cleethorpes Academy is an expansion and remodelling of the site to enable the school to increase pupil places to meet the growing demand for provision within this area of the borough.

This is a identified school expansion scheme as captured within the Schools Capital Programme, which will increase the capacity of the school by 150 places.

The procurement of this scheme has gone to all the relevant framework contractors for pricing.

This work has been viewed by the contractors who have in turn submitted their costs. We are happy with the price and quality responses and believe the tender report shows how competitive this price is whilst taking in to consideration the quality element of this tender.
