Prevention of public nuisance: Unreasonable levels of noise impact on adjoining residential properties

If possible please suggest alterations to the application that would resolve the problem mentioned above, again paying attention to the licensing objectives: I would like to request that the licence be granted to instead cover hours of operation Sunday to Thursday 12.00 to 11.30 hours, Friday and Saturday 12.00 to 01.00 hours. I would also like to request that noise mitigation works are undertaken to the building to reduce the impact on nearby residential properties in line with requirements that have to be met by other businesses in the area. The building currently has no such measures in place as previous licenced use and hours of operation did not require it. As it stands, it is basically a tin shed with nothing added to the walls or roof to reduce noise. Given the likely noise levels generated by music events like the one that was proposed for April now moved to July, and also other events where large numbers of people will attend (social media appears to suggest up to 2000 people), something will need to be put in place to attempt to minimise noise levels for surrounding properties. I make this request following the significant noise disruption and negative impact experienced by a large number of residential properties last year when the Tribe of Pirates music event took place. I have no issues with regeneration and improvement of the North Prom area and would welcome new and exciting uses of the existing buildings. I would in fact applaud the people behind this venture in trying to make better use of this space. I would just ask that this is done sympathetically, as residents are entitled to be able to enjoy their properties without being unreasonably impacted. There is obviously going to be some impact. I see no reason why however that the licence needs to cover the times of operation requested. Most existing businesses stand quiet and with low occupation during weekdays and nights, even in the summer months. Weekends are of course significantly busier when most people are not at work, which is recognised and accepted subject to the aforementioned mitigation. Thank you.
