The decision is in accordance with the resolutions and delegations (see below) established in relation to Cleethorpes Levelling Up Fund (LUF) Projects of 14th June 2023 (Cabinet Decision Notice DN.11).

Cabinet resolved:

- 1. That the plans for progressing the Levelling Up Fund projects as set out in the report be noted.
- 2. That the Director of Economy, Environment, and Infrastructure, in consultation with the Leader of the Council be delegated authority to procure and appoint professional design, technical, regeneration, including associated specialist skills, and contractors, required to progress and deliver the Cleethorpes Levelling Up Fund projects.
- 3. That the Director of Economy, Environment, and Infrastructure, in consultation with the Leader of the Council, be authorised to:
- a. Defray the LUF grants within the terms of any conditionality.
- b. Undertake all ancillary activity reasonably arising in support and implementation of the above recommendations.

4. That the Assistant Director Law and Governance (Monitoring Officer) be authorised to execute and complete all requisite legal documentation in relation to the matters outlined above.

2. Subject and details of the matter (to include reasons for the decision)

Approval to award the contract to secure a principal contractor for Sea Road development.

The new Sea Road building is a part of the £18.4million Levelling Up Funding the Council has received from the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC) for three new projects in Cleethorpes. They support the Council's strategic priorities of 'Stronger Economies' and 'Stronger Communities' and directly relate to indicators outlined in the Council's 'Outcomes Framework', in particular 'Investing in our future' and 'economic recovery and growth'.

On 1st August 2023 the Leader of the Council, Councillor Phillip Jackson and Portfolio Holder for Culture Heritage and the Visitor Economy, Councillor Hayden Dawkins, supported by officers, approved the detailed elements of the external building designs for Sea Road development. These building designs were also presented to the Tourism and Visitor Economy Scrutiny Panel on the 5th October 2023.

The Council's delivery partner, Equans held a market engagement event on 14th September 2023 for the Sea Road development, which was attended by main contractors, subcontractors, and local supply chain suppliers.

A procurement exercise was undertaken using the open procedure to procure and appoint a principal contractor for Cleethorpes LUF Sea Road project in line with the Councils Contract Procedure Rules (CPRs). Approval is requested to complete the contract award for this procurement.

There are no budget implications arising from the appointment of this principal contractor as the tender cost is within budget availability. The project has been allocated an appropriate contingency and where required value engineering will be undertaken during the life of the contract to ensure the project remains within the funding available.

3. Decision being taken

That the Director of Economy, Environment, and Infrastructure, in consultation with the Leader of the Council approve the contract award for the appointment of Jem Build Limited as the principal contractor for the Sea Road project, in accordance with NELC's CPRs.

5. Anticipated outcome(s)/benefits

Progression to the construction of the Sea Road building will support the objectives and opportunities which are identified in the Council Plan, Economic Strategy, Local Plan and Cleethorpes' Masterplan.

A new three-storey building constructed on the brownfield site on Sea Road, comprising of public amenities and a changing places facility, as well as commercially lettable space across all floors of the building, which may include different providers in hospitality.

The construction of the Sea Road development will be completed within DLUHC grant funding deadlines and budget availability.

This development will continue the regeneration of Cleethorpes, strengthening the local economy and improving infrastructure which will have positive impacts on health, wellbeing, and safety within the town.

Do Nothing - The Council could choose to not progress any of the works. However, this would mean the loss of the LUF grant awarded to the Council by the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities to improve the site.

Financial risks have already been mitigated by receiving the LUF funding in 2023. Any further cost overruns during delivery of the project will be mitigated for through early risk reporting, value engineering and allocated contingency sums.
