| Prevention of Public Nuisance        | The change of use of the building from a cafe to a restaurant will see an increased usage of the building. An alcohol establishment and the Extension of trading hours will have a significant impact on this area. Instead of closing at 4pm as had been the case the hours will be 10.30 Pm an extension of 5.5 hours. it is set to open at 8am an hour earlier than previously. It is a total of 6.5 hours than the previous business.  I would argue that as 49 Seaview St is situated on a very busy corner and with tables and chairs placed on the pavement this will create a Public safety issue. Pedestrian access will be impeded. This will be more troublesome for disabled and mobility scooter users. I draw the panels attention to this as it occurs with already existing premises on the opposite corner  With patrons being allowed to exit and re-enter the premise regarding smoking/vaping etc. They will add to the issue of blocking pavements etc. We also have to be mindful that some patrons may take drinks out to consume on said pavement. This creates the possibility of more, nuisan noise and inaccessibility for many other street users  I could write more but I believe sufficient has been provided, not only in terms of the street geography of the premises, street access and potential environmental noise impact and pollution as exists with the extra 6.5 extra opening hours to cease. |
