

Licensing Act 2003

Representation on a Licensing Application



Representations may be made at any time during a period of 28 consecutive days starting on the day after the application was given to the Licensing Authority.

In the case of a closure order issued by the Police, representations may be made during the seven days that follow relevant notice being given to the Local Authority by the Magistrates Court, starting on the day after the day the notice was received.

Representations must be relevant to the application. To be relevant they must relate to at least one of the four **Licensing Objectives** listed below:

- **The Prevention of Crime and Disorder**
- **Public Safety**
- **Prevention of Public Nuisance**
- **The Protection of Children from Harm**

Note: Please be aware that that this form cannot be treated as confidential. Your representation will be passed to the Applicant or to the representative of the Applicant to allow them the opportunity of addressing your concerns. This form will also be published on the council's website and read out in public at the sub-committee hearing.

Objectives	Evidence
The Prevention of Crime and Disorder	<p>Drink Driving – Later opening times will only make it worse.</p> <p>Anti-Social behaviour – Increased noise levels during night hours, to well above the permitted levels. With people shouting, screaming, swearing etc outside, causing anti-social behaviour.</p>
Public Safety	<p>Drink Driving – Later opening times will only make it worse.</p> <p>Parking illegally – This causes a nuisance to pedestrians, as they park on paths and grass verges. As well as blocking driveways, so residents cannot get out of their properties safely or sometimes not at all.</p> <p>Opening longer and offering extra events will bring more vehicles into the area.</p>
Prevention of Public Nuisance	<p>Excessive noise – Increased noise levels during night hours, to well above the permitted levels. With people shouting, screaming, swearing etc outside, causing anti-social behaviour.</p> <p>As well as the constant loud noise and bass from the music and karaoke.</p> <p>Increasing the opening times, will just make things worse. Changing the times to 0100, every Friday and Saturday, is going to make it unbearable for residents.</p>
The Protection of Children from Harm	<p>Some residents have young children who's sleep is impacted by excessive Noise, from the Social Club, throughout the night.</p>

If possible please suggest alterations to the application that would resolve the problem mentioned above, again paying attention to the licensing objectives

I would just like to say, like many residents, we don't have an issue with a Social Club. But changes to the current licence and how it has evolved over the years, from a "Working men's Club" into a Pub, Music venue and Nightclub. It has out grown its current location and would be better suited in an area which can accommodate its requirements.

We have spoken to some of the Social Clubs committee members and Club manager, about the issues and concerns. They have been great in listening to them and trying to resolve them, but unfortunately it isn't enough, nor can they prevent it all the time.

Unfortunately there is also the fear from residents of speaking up against the Social Club, due to fear of aggression and repercussions, which has been seen in the past.

Relocation – Relocate to an area that isn't surrounded by residential properties and has better parking facilities. Such as the old Healing village hall on Great Coates Road, Poplar park area (Which already has commercial properties, including the Healing village hall or Outskirts of the village (This aligns with other venues which are similar like The Healing Royal British Legion)

Excessive Noise – Reduce opening times to 0900 – 2100. Install sound monitoring equipment to monitor compliance with licence and regulations.

Anti-social behaviour – Reduce opening times to 0900 – 2100.

Parking – Implement a residential parking permit system and allocate designated parking spots. Install double yellow lines on bends and in front of people's driveways, as a minimum.
