This booklet describes the memorial options available at Grimsby Crematorium, opening times of the Bereavement Office, Chapel and Gardens of Remembrance including burial and memorial options for Scartho and Cleethorpes cemeteries and the Woodlands natural burial cemetery.

of Burial and Crematorium Authorities (FBCA) and the Institute of Cemeteries and Crematorium Management (ICCM), adheres to the Code of Cremation Practice and works within the Charter to the Bereaved, copies available upon request.

Crematorium Gardens

At Grimsby Crematorium we endeavour at all times to create an atmosphere of peace and respect.

The Crematorium grounds cover nine acres. We sincerely hope that visitors find the gardens to be a place where they may spend time in quiet contemplation and reflection.

Visitors may choose to leave floral tributes within the gardens and you are respectfully requested to place these in the flower vases provided, on the paved areas or within the Cloisters. Crematorium attendants remove flowers that have begun to fade twice a week.

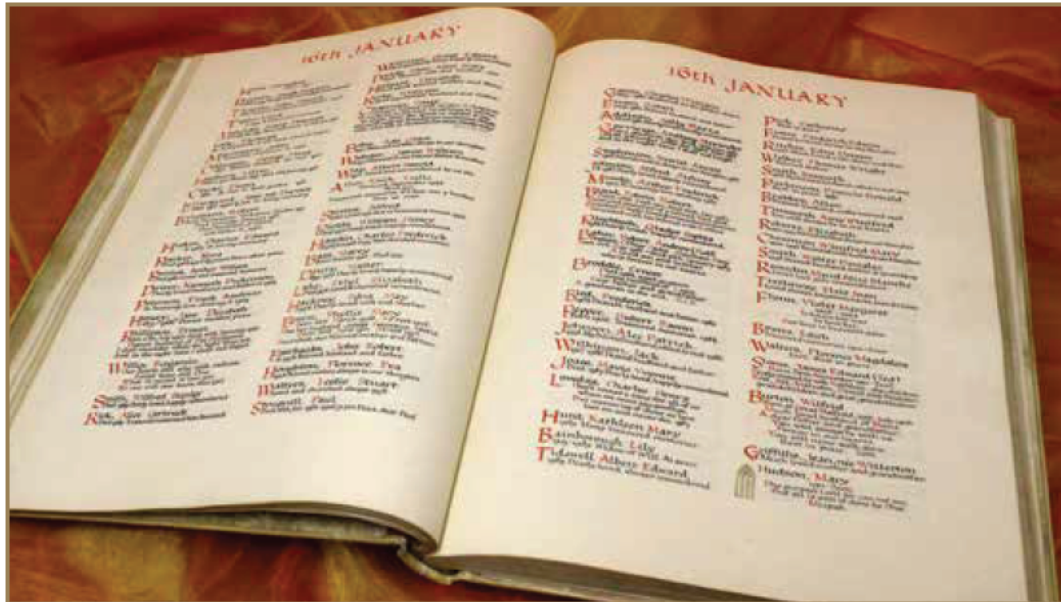

The Books of Remembrance



Book of Remembrance Application Forms

Only one entry can be placed within The Book of Remembrance, the detachable application form is located at the back of this booklet. Please note that applicants of the funeral may

only apply or authorise an entry in the Book of Remembrance for the first ten years after death. The Bereavement Services team will be pleased to assist you with any queries you may have.

The Books of Remembrance

The Books of Remembrance are displayed at Grimsby Crematorium to provide an elegant and lasting memorial to the departed.

The Books are in four volume sets, one for each quarter of the year, and are beautifully bound in natural vellum. The leaves are of archival quality mould-made paper which ensures a lasting and traditional memorial. The entries are carefully inscribed by hand by highly skilled calligraphers and are made in permanent colours under the date of death. Should you wish to place an entry in the book, entries in the Book of Remembrance, entries will be prepared so that they may be viewed on the first anniversary of the date of death, provided that applications are received as follows:


January, February, March - To be received
by the preceding 20th October

April, May, June - To be received by the
preceding 20th January


5 July, August, September - To be
received by the preceding 20th April

October, November, December - To be
received by preceding 20th July

The Books of Remembrance

If the first anniversary has passed and you wish to have an entry placed in the Book of Remembrance, this is possible. There is no time limit placed on when an entry must be made.

Your own personal inscription may be of two, five or eight lines in length. With five and eight line inscriptions it is possible to have a motif or embellishment at the side of the entry. You may wish to include something that you feel says more about the person than words alone can convey - perhaps a flower, regimental or family crest or something that reflects

the interests or hobby that the person enjoyed, the choice is limitless.

The first line of the inscription should consist of the surname and forenames only. The remaining lines, can be used for an entry of your choice. Year of death may be included but this is entirely personal preference.

Memorials of Remembrance

Memorial Book

Any person may place an entry within the Memorial Book. The entry does not need to be the date of death it can be for any special or important date relating to the person who has died, for example, birthday, anniversary or any date which conveys a lasting memory (verification of death will be required).

The entries are hand inscribed memorial dedications.



In addition to the Book of Remembrance and the Memorial Book, personal miniature versions are available. In the miniature version a copy of the inscription from the main Book may be entered and further entries can be inscribed on subsequent pages.

Folded Memorial Cards are also available, which will be inscribed by hand and may include a motif or embellishment.

These books and cards are intended to be kept at home or sent to family or friends.

Decorated Urns & Keepsakes

Grimsby Crematorium have a selection of decorated urns and keepsakes for purchase, these are displayed in the waiting area of the Crematorium building.

The Bereavement Service team will be pleased to assist you with any queries you might have regarding prices, ordering and availability.



Crematorium Memorials

Memorials are available within the Crematorium building.

Access to memorials located within the crematorium are restricted to the Crematorium Chapel and Book of Remembrance opening times.

Memorial Tree

The tree is located in the waiting area of the Crematorium building.

The polished plaques are available on a five year licence.

Cloisters Memorial Wall Plaques

These are polished granite wall tablets with eight individual spaces for commemorative marble plaques, and they are inscribed with gold lettering.

Communal flower / plant stands are available. The licence period is for five years and at the end of this period you may retain the plaque or renew the licence.





Memorial Garden

Memorial Gardens

In quiet corners of the Gardens of Remembrance there are memorials available dedicated to the memory of your loved one. There are various options available for your consideration; the following items are available on licence.



Memorial Vault

All memorials are made from polished granite with a flower container, inscribed with your choice of dedication/embellishment.

Barbican Tower

A centre piece which accommodates individual granite tablets inscribed with your choice of dedication/embellishment.

Marble Vase Blocks

With a flower container and a granite memorial tablet for your choice of inscription and embellishment.

Granite Wall Plaque

Inscribed with your choice of dedication and recessed into a York stone-type surface in an attractive brick wall.

Memorial Bench Plaques

A memorial plaque with your choice of dedication.

Cemeteries

Both Scartho Road Cemetery and Beacon Avenue Cemetery offer a full burial service, burial of cremated remains and a designated cremated remains area. There are designated areas for multi faith, childrens/babies and for members of the Armed Forces, killed in conflict.

Located within Scartho Road Cemetery is our Woodland Burial Area for 'green' burials. These can be either full burials, burial of cremated remains or scattering of cremated remains. Within the Woodlands area we also offer burials for cremated remains of pets.

Everyone who enters the grounds of the crematorium and cemeteries is expected to conduct themselves with due reverence.

Respect for the environment and wildlife is expected at all times.

Entry to the crematorium and cemeteries is only permitted during opening hours.

Dogs - must be kept on a short lead, under control and all dog keepers must remove any dog faeces.

persons knowingly in breach of these requirements may be liable to prosecution.

Nuisance behaviour - The Manager is empowered to take such lawful action as he/she may consider appropriate against any person who commits any nuisance, who interferes with cremation or burials that are taking place, or who interferes with any memorial, plants, flowers or other objects. The provision of the crematorium and cemetery facilities is a statutory responsibility and as such governed by Acts, Regulations and Codes of Practice. As such any

No unauthorised vehicles may enter the **Crematorium** grounds unless prior agreement has been given by the Manager, with exception to disabled drivers.

Vehicles within the Cemeteries must be driven only on the roads with care and at slow speed. Priority must be given to funeral cars.

Regulations

Crematorium visitors may choose to leave floral tributes within the gardens and you are respectfully requested to place these on the areas provided or within the Cloisters. All ornaments and trinkets will be removed and these will be retained for your collection for one month. This is done so that the gardens can be maintained and cared for and that their overall appearance is one that visitors find to be pleasant.

- Private benches are not permitted within the grounds of the cemeteries or crematorium.
- Items of any description are not permitted to be placed on branches in trees, bushes or hedges.
- No person shall drop, throw or otherwise deposit and leave in the cemetery or crematorium buildings and grounds any wastepaper or refuse of any kind, except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.
- All flowers etc are laid at owners own risk, North East Lincolnshire Council will not be held responsible for any damage or missing items.
- Shrines of any description are forbidden in the grounds of the cemeteries and crematorium.
- Cremated remains shall not be scattered in the cemeteries or crematorium without prior consent.

Scartho Road and Cleethorpes Cemeteries

All memorials are subject to the submission of an application, payment of fee, copy of insurance cover and obtaining written approval from the Council.

Glass memorabilia of any kind including vases is **not** permitted within the cemetery grounds.

The Council does not accept responsibility for memorials or any items left on the grave.

The Council reserves the right to remove or lay flat any hazardous or dangerous memorial.

- Memorial sizes - maximum height 39" x maximum width 30". Kerbset or garden, maximum length 72" (measured from the back of the memorial)
- Cremated Remains memorial size - maximum height 24" (including base) x maximum width 24". Kerbset or garden, maximum length 30" (measured from the back of the memorial).
- Ornamental chippings or stones are not permitted unless enclosed in a kerbset fitted by a registered monumental mason and for which approval has been granted.
- Informal fences, kerbstones or other means of enclosure will be removed as matter of course if they pose a danger to visitors or restrict access to neighbouring graves or if the grave is not maintained.
- Informal fences and or gardens should not exceed the dimensions for formal kerbsets for either full or cremated remains graves.
- Trees should not be planted upon grave space due to the long term effects root systems can have on surrounding memorials.
- A memorial cannot be erected or a garden created until levelling has taken place, a minimum of 6 months to a maximum of 12 month.

Regulations

Woodlands Burial, Scartho Road Cemetery

Green burial provides a natural resting place for our loved ones. Gradually over the years the woodland will develop along with its population of birds and small mammals. **To maintain the natural surroundings the following rules/regulations must be adhered to:-**

- In keeping with the natural burial ethic only string (biodegradable) tied fresh flowers sprays are allowed on the grave (no wrappings/ ribbons/ wired etc). These can be placed on the grave at the time of interment and we reserve the right to remove them after 1 week.
- No cultivation or reshaping or adornment of the grave plot is permitted.
- No planting on grave.
- No memorials shall be permitted for example (the list is not exhaustive):
 - Memorabilia
 - Statuary or personal effects
 - Bed stone
 - Edging or other stone
 - Shrines / statues
 - Photographs
 - Artificial flowers
 - Plants pots
 - Fences, masonry or woodwork
 - Vase ornaments
 - Any other structure
- The walking of dogs, on mown paths is permitted provided they are on a lead and any dog fouling is removed.

(Children's) Section 501,

Scartho Road Cemetery

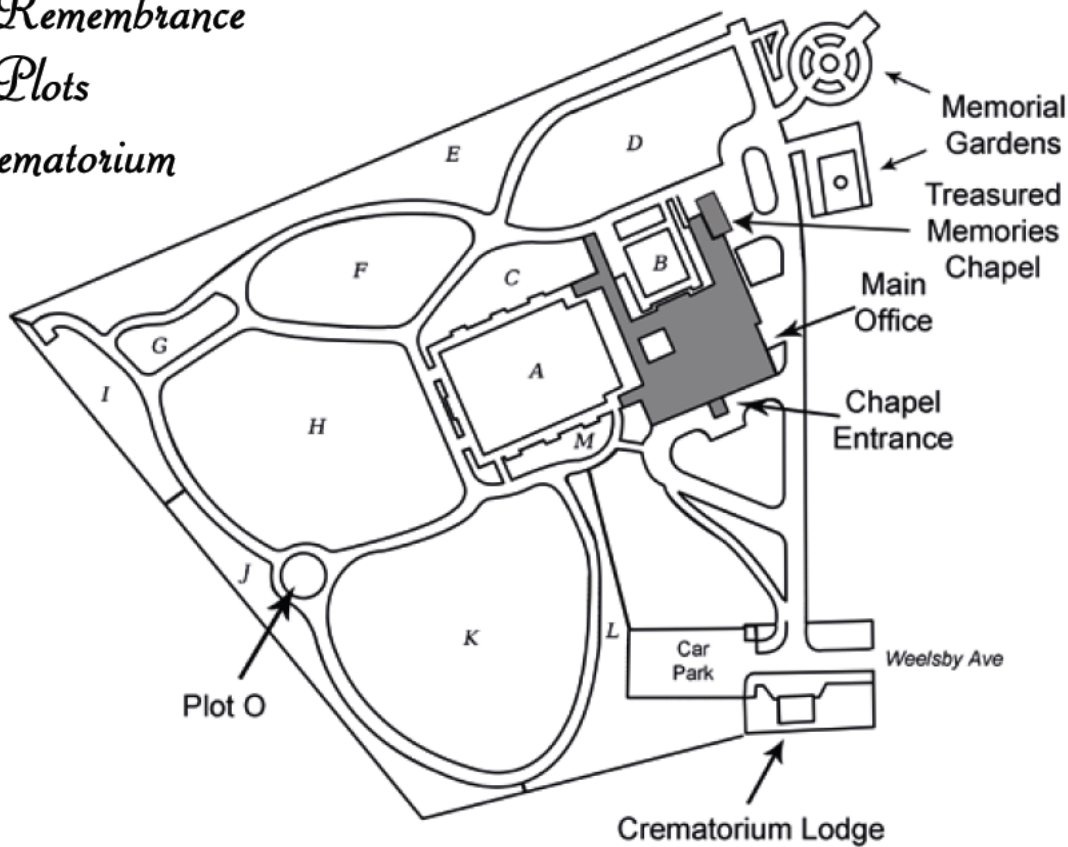
- Memorial sizes - maximum height 39" x maximum width 30" x maximum depth 12".
- A small garden measuring up to 18" from the concrete plinth will be permitted. This will be marked out once the ground has settled.
- Ornamental chippings or stones are **not** permitted.
- Informal fences or other means of enclosure will be removed as matter of course if they pose a danger to visitors or restrict access to neighbouring graves or if the grave is not maintained.
- Informal fences and or gardens should not exceed the above dimensions.
- Trees or shrubs are **not** permitted.
- A garden cannot be created until levelling has taken place, a minimum of 6 months to a maximum of 12 months.

(Cremated Remains / Ashes) Section 502,

Scartho Road Cemetery

- Memorial sizes - maximum height 24" x maximum width 24" x maximum depth 12".
- No other flower vessels are allowed.
- Ground cultivation, kerbsets, gardens or informal fences are **not** permitted.
- Ornamental chippings or stones are **not** permitted.
- Glass memorabilia of any kind including vases is **not** permitted within the cemetery grounds.
- Trees or shrubs are **not** permitted.
