

All children want to be valued and have a sense of belonging in their school. Although belonging is equally important for all children, children who have experienced childhood trauma are less likely to experience a deep sense of belonging without unconditional positive regard.

- > A child in our care, age 10 who is making really good progress in Reading, Writing & Maths, achieving excellent scores in her practice SATS.
- A child in our care, age 5 who has kept her new hearing aids in at school, achieving a sticker every day!
- A child in our care, age 14 who has had a prolonged absence from school has been supported back into regular Education by his new setting and residential unit.
- > A child in our care, age 15 who has found a place of belonging at his new school and is now closing those gaps in his learning as well as becoming a Student Leader.
- A child in our care, age 15 who after following a bespoke education package, has successfully transitioned back into full time mainstream education.
