

# NORTH EAST LINCOLNSHIRE BOROUGH COUNCIL



## **The North East Lincolnshire Borough Council (Waltham Gateway Academy, Grimsby) (School Safety Measures) (No. 24-03) Order 2024**

North East Lincolnshire Council, hereinafter referred to as “the Council”, in exercise of powers conferred upon it under Sections 1, 2, and 4 and Part IV of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended (hereinafter referred to as “The Act of 1984”), and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to The Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order.

## 1 Title

- 1.1 This Order shall come into operation on the \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2025 and may be cited as The North East Lincolnshire Borough Council (Waltham Gateway Academy, Grimsby) (School Safety Measures) (No. 24-03) Order 2024.

## 2 Definitions

- 2.1 In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:

**“A Person Authorised By The Council”** means a person employed in accordance with Section 76 of The Act of 2004 to carry out the functions therein;

**“The Act of 1984”** means The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

**“The Act of 2004”** means the Traffic Management Act 2004;

**“Article”** means the Article of this Order unless otherwise stated and includes reference to any paragraph to that Article referred to by number or letter;

**“Civil Enforcement Officer”** means a person employed by, or on behalf of, the Council under the provisions of Part 6 of The Act of 2004 and in accordance with Section 76 of The Act of 2004 authorised to enforce the restrictions imposed by this Order and to carry out the functions therein;

**“Council”** means North East Lincolnshire Borough Council and includes any parking services contractors or authorised agents appointed by or acting on behalf of the Council for the purposes of any function under the provisions of this Order;

**“Delivering”** or **“Delivery”** or **“Collection”** means a continuous activity during which Goods or Merchandise are Loaded or Unloaded from a vehicle to adjacent premises or nearby premises including a reasonable time for the checking of those Goods or Merchandise for the purpose of their Delivery or Collection;

**“Disabled Person’s Badge”** shall bear the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (exemptions for disabled persons) regulations 2000 (as modified or superseded from time to time).

**“Disabled Person’s Parking Disc”** shall bear the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (exemptions for disabled persons) regulations 2000 (as modified or superseded from time to time).

**“Driver”** in relation to the vehicle Stopped or Waiting on any Prohibited Road or on any School Keep Clear Area, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left Stopped on any School Keep Clear Area, or the person deemed to be the Driver by a Police Officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform acting under the terms of this Order;

**“Emergency”** shall be defined as a situation that poses an imminent risk to health, life, property or environment which requires immediate intervention.

**“Emergency Vehicle”** shall bear the same meaning as in Regulation 3(2) of the Road Vehicle Lighting Regulations 1989 (as modified or superseded from time to time).

**“Enactment”** means any enactment, whether public, general or local, and includes any order, bylaw rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

**“Fee”** in relation to Waivers means a non-refundable charge levied by the Council;

**“Funeral And Wedding Vehicles”** means those vehicles attending funerals or weddings to which Penalty Charge Notices will not be issued pursuant to the Council’s Civil Parking Enforcement Procedures 2018 as it relates to Funerals and Weddings;

**“Goods”** and **“Merchandise”** means goods of any kind whether animate or inanimate and includes Postal Packets of any kind that require transportation by a vehicle;

**“Loading”** and **“Unloading”** means a continuous activity during which Goods or Merchandise are placed in or taken from a vehicle that is Waiting at premises or adjacent to premises or nearby premises for the purpose of Delivery or Collection of those Goods or Merchandise provided that the Loading, Unloading, Delivery and/or Collection activities are completed in a time deemed reasonable by a Police Officer in uniform, Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform or A Person Authorised by the Council. Where no signs of Loading or Unloading activity are observed over the Observation Period it will be deemed that Loading or Unloading is not taking place;

**“No Stopping Hours”** means in relation to any School Keep Clear Area the hours during which Stopping is prohibited as specified in Schedule 2 and shown indicatively on The Plans to this Order.

**“Observation Period”** means a period of time during which a Police Officer in uniform, Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform or A Person Authorised by the Council undertakes observations pursuant to the Council’s parking enforcement policy;

**“The Plans”** means the schedules and drawings attached to this Order indicating the extents of parking restrictions.

**“Postal Packet(s)”** has the same meaning as in section 125 Postal Services Act 2000;

**“Prohibited Hours”** means in relation to each individual Prohibited Road the hours whereby Waiting prohibited during the hours specified in Schedule 1, 2 & 3 and shown indicatively in The Plans to this Order.

**“Prohibited Road”** means any of the sides or lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1, 2 & 3 and as shown indicatively on The Plans where Waiting is prohibited.

**“Relevant Position”** in respect of:-

- a) a disabled person’s badge means exhibited on the windscreen, dashboard or fascia of the vehicle with the obverse side facing forwards on the nearside of and immediately behind the windscreen or where the vehicle does not have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle orientated so that the whole of the information on the front of the permit is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle;

a waiver certificate means exhibited on the windscreen, dashboard or fascia of the vehicle with the obverse side facing forwards on the nearside of and immediately behind the windscreen or where the vehicle does not have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle orientated so that the whole of the information on the front of the permit is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle

**“School Keep Clear Areas”** mean the lengths of carriageway specified in Schedule 2, 3 and as shown indicatively on The Plans.

**“Security Vehicle”** means a vehicle designed or adapted for or in use for the conveyance of bullion, monies and currency and other securities;

**“Statutory Undertaker(s)”** has the same meaning as in Section 329 of the Highways Act 1980;

**“Stop” or “Stopping” or “Stopped”** refer to the stopping of a vehicle and it remaining at rest for some time whether or not the Driver is still in the vehicle and a vehicle shall be deemed to be waiting for any period in the same School Keep Clear Area if any part of the School Keep Clear Area is below the vehicle or the vehicle’s load (if any) whether or not the vehicle is moved during that period;

**“Telecommunication System”** has the same meaning as “electronic communications network in the Communications Act 2003;

**“Traffic Regulation Order”, “Order” or “TRO”** have the same meaning respectively, that being an Order made under Section 1 of The Act of 1984;

**“Trailer”** has the same meaning as that in Section 136 of The Act of 1984;

**“Universal Service Provider”** shall bear the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000;

**“Wait” and “Waiting”** refer to the stopping of a vehicle and it remaining at rest for some time whether or not the Driver is still in the vehicle and a vehicle shall be deemed to be waiting for any period in the same Prohibited Road if any part of the Prohibited Road is below the vehicle or the vehicle’s load (if any) whether or not the vehicle is moved during that period;

**“Waiver”** means electronic or hard copy of an exemption issued by or on behalf of the Council for the purposes of this Order permitting a specified vehicle to Stop in specified circumstances on a length or lengths of road where

the Stopping of that vehicle would otherwise be restricted or prohibited under the terms and charges applicable at the time of issue.

- 2.2 For the purpose of this Order unless otherwise specified all references to any documents including Statutory Instruments, Regulations and policies and procedures of the Council relate to the current version of those documents as amended or substituted from time to time.
- 2.3 For the purpose of this Order the prohibitions and restrictions contained in the Articles to this Order and shown on the attached Plans and Schedules shall apply to the full extent of the public highway, with the exception of Clearways which apply to the extent of the carriageway only.
- 2.4 For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be taken as Stopped or is Waiting on a length of road if any point on that length of road is below the vehicle or its load (if any).
- 2.5 The prohibitions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any Regulations or Orders made or having effect as if made under The Act of 1984, or by or under any other Enactment.
- 2.6 For the purposes of this Order, North East Lincolnshire Council accepts no responsibility for any inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon in the preparation of The Plans attached to this Order. Where a restriction applies to the edge of a length of carriageway or highway (adjacent to the kerb) that restriction will continue to apply to the actual edge of carriageway or highway irrespective of changes to either the carriageway width or to the underlying Ordnance Survey data.
- 2.7 If a Court, the Department for Transport, the Traffic Penalty Tribunal or the Traffic Enforcement Centre declares any part of this Order to be invalid or un-enforceable, such declaration shall not invalidate the remainder of the Order.
- 2.8 Unless the context otherwise requires, the words in the singular shall include the plural and in the plural shall include the singular.

### **3 Exemptions**

- 3.1 Nothing in Article 4.1 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to Wait in any of the Prohibited Roads for so long as it may be necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle.
- 3.2 Nothing in Article 4.1 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to Wait in any of the Prohibited Roads for so long as it may be necessary to enable the Delivery or Collection of Goods including where Goods are Loaded onto or Unloaded from the vehicle provided that Loading or Unloading is carried out in one continuous operation.
- 3.3 Nothing in Articles 4.1 and 5.1 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to Wait in any of the Prohibited Roads or Stop in any of the School Keep Clear Areas for so long as it may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot

conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road and close proximity to the site is essential, to be used for the purpose of any Emergency building operation, demolition or excavation, or the maintenance or improvement or reconstruction of the said Prohibited Roads or School Keep Clear areas, or any works connected with any Statutory Undertaker's apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any Telecommunications System.

- 3.4 Nothing in Articles 4.1 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to Wait in any of the Prohibited Roads for so long as it may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of the Council in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
- 3.5 Nothing in Article 4.1 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to Wait in any of the Prohibited Roads for so long as it may be necessary to enable the vehicle of a Universal Service Provider (to Wait whilst Postal Packets addressed to premises adjacent to that Prohibited Road are being Unloaded from the vehicle or having Unloaded therefrom are being delivered or while Postal Packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent to that Prohibited Road, provided that the vehicle cannot reasonably be used for such purpose in any other road and for as long as may be necessary in conjunction with these purposes.
- 3.6 Nothing in Articles 4.1 and 5.1 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to Wait in any of the Prohibited Roads or Stop in any of the School Keep Clear Areas for so long as it may be necessary to enable an Emergency Vehicle to be used in the course of an Emergency.
- 3.7 Nothing in Articles 4.1 and 5.1 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to Wait in any of the Prohibited Roads or Stop in any of the School Keep Clear Areas for so long as it may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be used in any case where the person in control of the vehicle:
- a) is required by law to Stop or Wait or is permitted to Stop or Wait by a Police Officer in uniform or Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform;
  - b) is obliged to Stop or Wait so as to prevent an accident; or
  - c) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside their control.
- 3.8 Nothing in Article 4.1 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to Wait in any of the Prohibited Roads for so long as it may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be Loaded or Unloaded whilst it is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture and effects from one office or dwelling house to another or to such premises from a depository or from such premises to a depository notwithstanding anything contained in Article 3.2 above as to Waiting in the Prohibited Roads.
- 3.9 Nothing in Article 4.1 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to Wait in any of the Prohibited Roads for so long as it may be necessary to enable a Security Vehicle to be used in the course of Delivering or collecting cash to/from properties in any of the Prohibited Roads and being a vehicle specifically designed for that purpose.
- 3.10 Nothing in Article 4.1 to this Order shall apply to Funeral and Wedding Vehicles at a funeral or wedding.

- 3.11 Nothing in Article 4.1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Person's Badge and a Disabled Person's Parking Disc (on which the Driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of Waiting began) to Wait in any of the Prohibited Roads for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from the previous period of Waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).
- 3.12 Nothing in Article 4.1 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to Wait in any of the Prohibited Roads provided that permission has been obtained from the Council by means of a Waiver and providing that an obstruction is not caused by so doing and that the vehicle is moved if the Driver is requested to do so by a Police Officer in uniform or Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform.
- 3.13 Nothing in Articles 4.1 and 5.1 of this Order shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to Wait or Stop in any of the Prohibited Roads for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle if it cannot be used for such purpose without Waiting or Stopping on that length of road to be used in connection with the removal of any item in the highway where such moving may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of preventing obstruction.

#### **4 Provisions relating to Prohibition of Waiting restrictions**

- 4.1 Save as provided in Articles 3.1, 3.2, 3.3, 3.4, 3.5, 3.6, 3.7, 3.8, 3.9, 3.10, 3.11, 3.12 and 3.13 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Officer in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform cause or permit any vehicle (and/or drawn Trailer) to Wait in the Prohibited Roads during the Prohibited Hours specified in Schedule 1, 2 & 3 of this Order.

#### **5 Provisions relating to Prohibition of Stopping restrictions**

- 5.1 Save as provided in Articles 3.3, 3.4, 3.6, 3.7 and 3.13 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Officer in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform cause or permit any vehicle (and/or drawn Trailer) to Stop on any of the School Keep Clear Areas during the No Stopping Hours.
- 5.2 Notwithstanding any exemption listed in article 5.1, the person in control of a vehicle waiting on any of the lengths of road identified as School Keep Clear Areas on The Plans attached to this Order, shall move the vehicle on the instructions of a Police Constable in uniform whenever such moving may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of preventing an obstruction.

#### **6 Waivers**

- 6.1 Upon receipt of an application duly made under the provisions of this Order, the Council upon being satisfied that the applicant satisfies the requirements and on receipt of any Fee that the Council may from time to time determine, may issue to the applicant a Waiver for leaving a vehicle in the parts of the carriageway in which such Waivers are valid, provided that the Council may impose such conditions on the use of the Waiver as it considers appropriate and that any limit applying to the number of Waivers issued is not exceeded.

- 6.2 A Waiver may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid. Notification of such cancellation shall be in writing served on the person to whom such Waiver was issued by sending the same to the Waiver holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the Waiver, or at any other address believed to be that persons place of abode, requiring that person to surrender the Waiver to the Council within 48 hours of receipt of the aforementioned notice.

Woodhall Drive, Waltham, Grimsby	SOUTH EASTERN KERB LINE	From the north-eastern boundary of No. 39 Woodhall Drive in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 15 metres.
Woodhall Drive, Waltham, Grimsby	SOUTH EASTERN KERB LINE	From the western boundary of No. 41 Woodhall Drive in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 15 metres.
Lindrick Walk, Waltham, Grimsby	EASTERN KERB LINE	From the south-eastern kerb line of Woodhall Drive in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 10 metres.
Lindrick Walk, Waltham, Grimsby	WESTERN KERB LINE	From the south eastern kerb line of Woodhall Drive in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 10 metres.

Sunningdale, Waltham, Grimsby	SOUTH WESTERN KERB LINE	From the south-eastern property boundary of No. 23 Sunningdale in a generally north-westerly direction for a distance of 53.5 metres.
Archer Road, Waltham, Grimsby	NORTH EASTERN KERB LINE	From the north-eastern property boundary of No. 51 Archer Road in a generally south-easterly direction for a distance of 89 metres.

Lindrick Walk, Waltham, Grimsby	OUTER CIRCUMFERENCE OF THE ROUNDABOUT	From the north-western property boundary of No. 3 Lindrick Walk in a generally south-easterly direction around the roundabout for a distance of 37 metres.
Archer Road, Waltham, Grimsby	SOUTH WESTERN KERB LINE	From the extended north-western property boundary of No.55 Archer Road in a generally north-westerly direction for a distance of 33.5 metres.
Archer Road, Waltham, Grimsby	SOUTH WESTERN KERB LINE	From the extended north-western property boundary of No.55 Archer Road in a generally south-easterly direction for a distance of 33.5 metres.
Sunningdale, Waltham, Grimsby	NORTH WESTERN KERB LINE	From the north-eastern property boundary of No. 24 Sunningdale in a generally north-westerly direction for a distance of 43.5 metres.
