

# Briefing Note for Children's Scrutiny Meeting Thursday 31st July 2025

#### **SEND Provision**

This briefing note provides summary information on the latest position in relation to SENDAP provision. This briefing note focuses on provision being developed through the High Needs Capital Grant and the Department for Education Free School Programme. In addition to the provision, there is a range of work that is also being undertaken alongside this programme to develop and strengthen the workforce and associated services to support children from the earliest point of their education.

#### **SEMH Free School:**

The SEMH Free School project continues to progress, with the Local Authority securing the land off Freeman Street. Whilst this has come at an additional cost, the overall costs laid out by the Local Authority are estimated to be a fraction of the ongoing revenue costs that are related to children attending Independent Non Maintained Specialist provision and associated transport costs.

### **Humberston Park Academy:**

In June, agreement was sought from cabinet to explore options for an additional site. This exploration is ongoing, to enable Humberston Park to safely accommodate a growing number of children with profound, multiple learning disabilities. The current site off Thomas Close in Humberston is landlocked. Officers continue to work diligently to secure a second site and begin works as soon as possible.

### **Cambridge Park Academy extension:**

On schedule to complete end of August for the first three children to transition in at the start of the academic year. The overall numbers will grow to between 8 and 12 children aged 14-19 years of age. This extension to the existing provision will avoid children having to attend specialist provision, which is often residential out of area. As a worked example, all three children starting in September had places in out of area settings ready to start that were on average £40, 000 each more expensive (without transport costs) than a place at Cambridge Park within the new accommodation. This is therefore a cost avoidance from this September of approximately £120,000 that the LA has avoided spending on three children's provision.
