Criteria for serious harm notification includes serious child safeguarding incidents are those in which:

  - i. Abuse of neglect of a child is known or suspected **and**
  - ii. The child has died or been seriously harmed (serious harm includes (but is not limited to) serious and/or long-term impairment of a child's mental health or intellectual, emotional, social or behavioural development. It should also cover impairment of physical health<sup>1</sup>.
