1.1	The deputy chair opened the meeting.

1.3.1	Due to Darren Wildbore leaving the board the vacancy for the role of chair was discussed. SH nominated MP and this was seconded by NHR.	

1.3.2	AGREED: Chief Superintendent Matt Peach to adopt role of chair.	
2.	Discussion items	
2.1	Priority area: anti-social behaviour – Paul Condon	
2.1.1	Issues regarding the independent chairing of Community Trigger reviews have been resolved with the approval of ASB Help. A Victim Charter has been developed whereby victims are contacted within 24 hours, given weekly updates, and have the opportunity to make victim statements using their chosen method. We have committed to the ASB Help pledge and have been given approval to use their logo on all documentation.	
2.1.2	Work is in hand to further enhance the ASB panel and recruitment is underway to employ a new ASB youth crime coordinator who will run the ASB panel and have responsibility for knife crime. The two remaining ASB coordinators now work in line with the two neighbourhood policing teams – East and West. Monthly briefings are in place with the neighbourhood policing schemes.	
2.1.3	Nuisance behaviour PSPOs have been renewed for another three years. The drink-based PSPOs are to be reviewed later in the year. Response training is still on offer to police officers. Regular updates are being made onto the website, although there is more work to be done on social media channels.

2.2.1	There has only been one trigger this year. Figures are published each quarter on the SaferNEL website.

2.3.2	MP spoke about potential for co-location as police team working from Birchin Way.	
2.4	Priority area: Substance and alcohol misuse (including Drugs Strategy) – Mike Hardy	
2.4.1	A combating drugs partnership (name to be confirmed) is being established	

	at chief executive level. The chair will be the Director of Public Health for Greater Lincolnshire – Derek Ward. As Greater Lincolnshire is a large area	
	which doesn't have shared services in terms of Police and Probation, our partnership will operate for the Southbank area. The partnership will report to the Health and Wellbeing board.	
2.4.2	A joint assessment of needs will be completed by the end of November which needs to include the views of people with lived experience, and reflect the uniqueness of North East Lincolnshire. Governance is also being developed in terms of commissioning quality standards, workforce requirements, monitoring etc.	
2.4.3	Alcohol will be included, and drug testing on arrest will be returning to operation, although there is no information available on this as yet.

3.8	Update on domestic homicide reviews – Rebecca Freeman	
3.8.1	RF updated the board on the current DHRs. Now have seven that we are involved with, six owned by NEL and one to the London Borough of Newham.	
3.8.2	First one submitted to Home Office – this will be a test as the first one submitted. RF has sought permission from the Home Office not to publish the review as this could have a detrimental impact on the children.	
3.8.3	A second has now been submitted, and will be heard by the Home Office Quality Assurance Panel in January 2023.	
3.8.4	Five others are in progress.	
3.8.5	RF is on a working group with Home Office to develop a central repository of published reviews, and is speaking to another CSP with regards to issues within specific communities relating to DHRs (Polish community).	
3.8.6	Key themes and findings run through many of the DHRs, for example abuse as a child, and removal of children into care. These themes are being collated into a summary for further analysis.
