1	Welcome and Introductions	
1.2	<i>Presentation of commendations</i>	
1.2.1	Congratulations to Inspector Tom Stevens, Rachel Connor, Donna Chandler and Danny Mills who were presented with commendations for their dedication and support to community safety. A certificate of recognition for Chief Supt Darren Wildbore will be presented at a later date.	
1.3	<i>Arrangements for future chairing of meeting</i>	

1.3.1	UNANIMOUSLY AGREED: Spencer Hunt nominated Paul French as CSP Chair and Paul Caswell seconded. Paul French accepted the role.	
1.4	<i>Police Anti-Corruption Unit</i>	
1.4.1	Deferred.	
1.4.2	Action: Police Anti-Corruption Unit to be an agenda item for the May 2024 meeting.	1
1.5	<i>Clear Hold Build update– Inspector Robert Brook</i>	
1.5.1	There are 18 police forces nationally that have commenced Clear Hold Build projects so far. Within this there are 31 sites that are currently operational, including Nunsthorpe and Bridlington. The ministerial ambition is to have Clear Hold Build sites operational in every force by April 2024.	
1.5.2	The Nunsthorpe project had a really strong Clear operation which dismantled the main organised crime group on the estate. We have now moved into the Hold phase. Currently in the process of transferring the public house over to new tenants whilst working closely with licensing, the local authority and the brewery to ensure the pub is run in the interests of the local community.	
1.5.3	A great deal of community engagement is taking place to establish and maintain confidence in that space. A lot of work is being carried out with the schools in the area and a communication plan is being put into place. Further funding has been secured to focus on target hardening on the estate including CCTV. A multi-agency silver delivery group has also been set up to determine the priorities in the area going forwards.	
1.5.4	RB requested that the CSP consider if there are any opportunities to bring someone into the space that PC has moved out of.	
1.5.5	SH clarified that there is still strategic buy-in and Steven Lynn will be on the ground operationally. PC will still be available to offer advice.	
1.6	<i>Welcome and Introductions</i>	
1.6.1	The chair welcomed the group and introductions were made.

2.1	<i>CSP Newsletter</i>	
2.1.1	APPROVED: The chair and board members said the CSP newsletter was excellent.

2.2	<i>Violent Crime duty and update on VPP – Local strategy sign off Paul Caswell, Rebecca Freman, Gary Peck</i>	
2.2.1	The previously circulated strategy and delivery plan were shared with board members. GP gave the background to the VC duty. The Humber Violence Prevention Partnership has produced a Humber wide strategy and alongside this we have produced a local strategy and delivery plan.	
2.2.2	Consultations are live until the end of January and the results of these will form their own mini-action plan. We currently have 900 completed consultation forms from young people and 200 from adults.	
2.2.3	Action: Invite Andy Maultby to May CSP meeting.	5
2.2.4	Action: Determine thematic leads for each aspect of the delivery plan.	6
2.2.5	Action: Serious violence to be a standing item on the CSP agenda with updates from VAWG, NTE and serious youth violence on rotation. To start with NTE.	7
2.2.6	Discussions around the necessity of bleed kits and promotion of these also took place. EMAS will have details of all the locations of the bleed kits and can direct people to these if they dial 999. CCTV and safer streets ambassadors will all be aware of them.	
2.2.7	APPROVED: The strategy and plan were approved subject to one amendment.	
2.2.8	Action: Amend strategy and recirculate to board members for final sign off.	8
2.2.9	Action: Chair to forward paragraph on problem solving methodology to RF for inclusion in the strategy.	9
2.3	<i>Town Centre project update – Paul Caswell</i>	
2.3.1	The Grimsby Town Centre project is funded by the OPCC, the Activation Fund and UK Shared Prosperity funding. The Grimsby town centre is high on the council's agenda on a strategic level in relation to the town centre development.	
2.3.2	The Haven Youth Hub opened on 30 November 2023 with the Street Based Youth team now currently based there. This service is available six days per week with youth sessions and specialist drop ins.	
2.3.3	All partners involved in the project attend the Grimsby West area tasking meeting, jointly chaired by Claire Jacobs and Paul Caswell, and this is working really well.	

2.3.4	RF added that the safer streets ambassadors are key to the VAWG work in the town centre so we now have two ambassadors that go out in the every Friday and Saturday night from 5pm to 11pm to provide reassurance to customers and retailers, this is alongside the GRIP radios and CCTV. They are also linking in with partner agencies.	
2.3.5	Additional consultation is due to take place for night-time economy for adults, also parks and open spaces for younger people.	
2.3.6	PG added that personal safety apps had been given out to retailers and it would be useful for ambassadors and the control room to have access to the app.	
2.3.7	Action: RF to circulate Town Centre project presentation after the meeting.	10
2.3.8	Action: PC to look at hoodies policy issue raised by Cllr Westcott and provide feedback.	11
2.4	<i>Modern Slavery – Spencer Hunt & Victoria Henley</i>	
2.4.1	The Modern Slavery presentation was shared with Board members and an overview given. There is now a well-established modern slavery group which utilises police intelligence and takes a joint approach to addressing concerns, followed up by multi-agency visits to identified premises as necessary.	
2.4.2	Modern slavery champions have been recruited from partner organisations and attend at least three professional development events each year to enable them to raise awareness throughout Humberside.	
2.4.3	The strategy has been refreshed and a year-end report produced and published.	
2.4.4	The Who Is campaign is currently going out on our social media sites which highlights individuals who may be victims of modern slavery.	
2.4.5	There is a Modern Slavery exhibition taking place at Grimsby Minster from 3 February to 16 March. Additional fringe activities include workshops and awareness training.	
2.4.6	The modern slavery resources document produced by VH is available on the local government website.	
2.5	<i>Prevent – Spencer Hunt</i>	
2.5.1	The strategy has been revised in 2023 with some new duties including a partnership evaluation.	
2.5.2	Action: Prevent to be an agenda item for the May meeting.	12
3.	Business Functions	
3.1	<i>Minutes / actions of last meeting – Chair</i>	

3.1.1	The minutes of 7 November 2023 were agreed as an accurate reflection of the meeting.	
3.1.2	One action is outstanding which is to generate greater linkages between the council website and Safer NEL website. This is to be conducted as part of a wider council review of websites.	
3.1.3	All remaining actions have been completed or included in the context of this meeting.	
3.2	<i>Finance & resourcing report including updates on project bids – Rebecca Freeman</i>	
3.2.1	The finance and resourcing paper was circulated to Board members prior to this meeting.	
3.2.2	The Board supports reduction from £40,000 to £20,000 for high risk domestic abuse and over the next few months to formally review the financial position and bring this back to the CSP. RF added that we would be working on an assumption that the contributions will remain the same but this is yet to be confirmed and the PCC is up for re-election in May 2024.	
3.2.3	APPROVED: The board approved the decision to reduce contributions to high risk domestic abuse in 2024/25 to £20,000.	
3.2.4	Action: Arrange an additional CSP Board meeting in March to discuss this finance and performance in detail.	13
3.3	<i>Performance update including Control Strategy intel requirements Theme leads & Rebecca Freeman</i>	
3.3.1	The performance paper was circulated to Board members prior to this meeting.	
3.4	<i>ASB Case Review quarterly update by exception – Paul Caswell</i>	
3.4.1	There were two ASB case reviews in the previous quarter and one this quarter that went to appeal and the original decision was upheld. The complainant is still being supported by police and by NELC noise enforcement.	
3.5	<i>Domestic Homicide Reviews– Rebecca Freeman</i>	
3.5.1	There are currently 4 DHRs in progress and a meeting shortly to look at a potential 5 more DHRs. No funding has been identified by the CSP to fund these reviews (see 3.2.4).	
3.5.2	The Domestic Abuse Commissioner’s Office has selected our area for a national oversight pilot project.	
3.6	CSP review consultation	

3.6.1	Following the OPCC review there has been an off-shoot piece of work around reviewing CSPs. RF has circulated and completed on behalf of the CSP and submitted responses.
