North East Lincolnshire Borough Council PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER 2025

Cleethorpes Seafront (from Cleethorpes Leisure Centre to North Sea Lane Roundabout)

This Order is made by North East Lincolnshire Council in exercise of its power under section 59 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 (the "Act").

- 1. The Order applies to the public areas shown on the map annexed to this Order (the "Restricted Area").
- 2. The Council is satisfied that the following conditions have been met:
 - a) Activities have been carried out in the Restricted Area that have had a
 detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality, or it is likely
 that activities will be carried out in the area and they will have such an
 effect; and
 - b) The effect, or likely effect of the activities is, or is likely to be, persistent or of a continuing nature, and is, or is likely to be, such that the activities are unreasonable and the effect justifies the restrictions imposed.
- 3. This Order shall have effect for a period of 3 years, commencing on 14th July 2025 and remaining in force until 13th July 2028.
- 4. The effect of this Order is to impose the following prohibitions:
 - a) Engaging in any activity or behaviour that causes, or is likely to cause, nuisance, alarm, harassment, distress, or intimidation to any persons.
 - b) Engaging in any activity or behaviour that threatens the safety of that person or any other person.
 - c) Using foul or abusive language directed at or towards any other person.
 - d) Playing music or generating noise at a volume, or in a manner, likely to cause a nuisance.
 - e) Lighting any open fire in a public space.
 - f) Driving in such a manner that causes or is likely to cause nuisance, alarm, harassment, distress, or intimidation to any person.

- g) Sounding a vehicle horn unnecessarily or in a manner likely to cause a nuisance, except where required by law.
- h) Revving a motor engine excessively, repeatedly, or in a manner likely to cause a nuisance.
- i) Participating in the behaviour listed in clauses 4(f)- 4(h), whether as a driver, registered keeper, or passenger of the vehicle, or by congregating to spectate or otherwise encourage the aforementioned activities.
- 5. The effect of this Order is to impose the following requirement:

Where a Police Constable or an Authorised Officer has reasonable grounds to believe that a person or group is engaging, or has engaged in, any activity prohibited by this Order, that officer may require the person or group to immediately disperse from the Restricted Area, and to not return to the Restricted Area for a period up to 24 hours, as specified by the officer.

6. Any person who, without reasonable excuse, fails to comply with any of the prohibitions or requirements set out in this Order commits an offence under section 67 of the Act, and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (currently £1000).

A Police Constable or Authorised Officer may issue a fixed penalty notice to any person who they reasonably believe has committed an offence under this Order. The recipient of such notice will have 14 days to pay the fixed penalty of £100. Failure to pay the fixed penalty within this period may result in prosecution.

7. Any challenge to this Order must be made at the High Court within 6 weeks of it being made by someone who lives in, regularly works in or visits the Restricted area.

The validity of the Order may be challenged on the grounds that:

- a) The Council acted beyond its powers in making the Order, or including certain provisions; or
- b) The Council failed to comply with the procedural requirements prescribed by The Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014.

When an application is made, the High Court may decide to suspend the operation of the Order, in whole or in part, pending their decision. The High Court has the authority to uphold, quash or vary the Order.
