
















# Do you feel that news and information about North East Lincolnshire affects your own opinion?


The following graph represents the most common themes collated from the open text box results. These comments and reasons are given in relation to the question above. These do not always directly answer the question asked, however are still considered and collected.







Thinking about the news and information from residents, and local and national media – how could North East Lincolnshire Council improve the perception of the area?



The following quotes are collected from answers to the previous question and chart to provide more depth and reasoning to the most common themes.

"Be more active in promoting the area and sharing positive views."

"Tell people more about the good going on in the area."

"The Council needs to put more news out about the positive things happening in the borough. Not enough is done or it is reactive. There should be a constant feed of good news stories, case studies, honesty about why regeneration is taking so long. Be open and honest. Build the trust."

"Respond to negative comments and perceptions when they are inaccurate by giving more details and being transparent where this is feasible - i.e. doesn't involved sharing sensitive information. Where information is vague people make up their own scenarios and are suspicious of what's happening."

"Trees, we need more trees and tree lined streets. It absolutely TRANSFORMS areas."

"They need to improve the actual area first. So personal experience is better.

Listen to people and provide what people want that's how to get people to be more positive not run the town into the ground."

"Listen to residents, stop spending money on ill thought-out ideas, find out what the local communities need and not what the council think money should be spent on."

"Stop the town centre in Grimsby looking so run down and grey. Smarten up empty shops, ensure owners upkeep property appropriately. Regular patrols to stop cyclists/antisocial behaviour."

"The SSSI areas to the south of the leisure centre are spectacular, hosting a vast array of wildlife... the council should nurture and promote these fantastic areas we're blessed with and make our area's natural features a selling point."

"Listen to the residents instead of making decisions before giving them the chance and time to air their views." Focus groups were held to gather further insight and develop a more comprehensive study. These focus groups consisted of 7 adults and 20 students (aged 16-17). The themes collated from these discussions are as shown below:
