

Duke of Edinburgh

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award has a 70-year history and is well regarded as an achievement beyond academics, valuable for CVs. Entry starts at age 14 or Year 9 equivalent, and participants set their own pace—completion can range from 6 months to several years. The program centers around individual interests. Bronze level includes four sections: skill, volunteering, physical activity, and expedition. Activities average one hour per week, with most requiring three months and one lasting six months. Home-educated students benefit from flexibility and can use existing extracurriculars, such as music or sport, for relevant sections.
