<b>2.2</b>	<b><i>Horizon Youth Zone – Lucy Ottewell-Key</i></b>	
2.2.1	Practical completion took place three weeks ago and staff have been recruited. Currently in a three-month soft opening period during which training is being undertaken, final deliveries are being accepted, and volunteers are being recruited. School soft opening is starting next week where local schools are bringing in groups of pupils to visit and use the equipment.	
2.22	After Christmas controlled openings will commence based on previous expressions of interest in order to test the processes, with a grand opening in February. Following that the centre will be open seven days a week comprising evenings, weekends and holidays.	
2.23	The pricing model is £5 per year membership and 50p per session. There is an arts and heritage offer and employability offer, supported by partnerships with local organisations. Good relationships are being built with local authority, including representation on their board; Baby Zone to bring a whole family offer; Grimsby Town Foundation; NAViGO; With You; Greater Lincolnshire Sexual Health; Orsted; Phillips66; and community partners to conduct specific activities.	
2.24	The community safety team, on behalf of the CSP, is delivering Prevent and VAWG training to Horizon staff. Green Influencers are also developing a pathway to work alongside Horizon.	
2.25	Currently unable to anticipate impact on criminality in the area but data from the national OnSide network suggests a positive effect.	

2.26	Horizon is supported by the wider borough youth offer, and there are plans for a Youth Strategy which is currently being mapped out.	
2.3	<i>Op Mandala, including vape shop visits – Rebecca Freeman and Paul Caswell on behalf of Pete Musgrave</i>	
2.3.1	<p>Key points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Multi-agency with Trading Standards (Mick Funnell lead)</li> <li>▪ Links in with Safer Streets (Summer &amp; Winter Plans) both Freeman St, Cleethorpes and Town Centre locations</li> <li>▪ Several visits/warrants already conducted</li> <li>▪ Large quantities of vapes and illegal tobacco seized</li> <li>▪ Prosecutions starting to come through – 2 males convicted last week</li> <li>▪ Potential OCG being mapped in GY area</li> <li>▪ Further visits/warrants planned for Q4 with TS</li> <li>▪ ‘Tip of the iceberg’ as shops refilled almost immediately</li> <li>▪ Public Health issues with the vapes themselves</li> <li>▪ Children enticed to buy (bright lights, fancy shops etc)</li> </ul>	
2.3.2	Whilst we celebrate our successes, concern was expressed around new vape shops opening with a wider spread across the borough, and existing shops restocking as soon as visits have been conducted. This will continue to be a concern whilst legislation allows this, although national policy change is in progress.

2.4	<i>Elective home education and exploitation – Ann-Marie Matson on behalf of Joe White</i>	
2.4.1	A number of partnership community working groups have been held with a view to launching a strategy in 2026.	
2.4.2	There are currently c. 400 children electively home educated which is showing a slight downward trend.

2.5.1	The final draft of the partnership plan was shared onscreen. Other than amendments to the foreword board members were happy with the design work undertaken.	5

2.5.3	<b>ACTION:</b> Board members to review the plan as below and confirm to RF that they have no further amendments to make.	
2.5.4	Process Black has also been asked to update our CSP logo which has become very dated.	
		
2.6	<i>Op Prowess – Rebecca Freeman and Paul Caswell on behalf of Pete Musgrave</i>	
2.6.1	Operation Prowess is Humberside Police's response to tackling serious violence, knife crime and anti-social behaviour which is funded by the Home Office. It provides targeted high visibility, foot patrols within high harm, hotspot areas to engage with our communities and offer reassurance. Areas within NEL are West Marsh, East Marsh, and Cleethorpes to match the Summer Plan for towns and Winter Plan for towns.	6
2.6.2	A funding bid was submitted specifically in relation to ASB issues Grant Thorold Park which brought resource for youth diversion and patrols. The CSP analyst has reviewed the data between February and to date and all crime in East Marsh has reduced substantially. We are now back to levels seen in 2022. CCTV continues to monitor any ongoing offences.	
2.6.3	Work continues with Youth Justice to prevent future increases. This is overseen by our Place Based group and we work with both NELC youth outreach and diversion, plus external providers such as Fusion and Trin, to get upstream of any potential issues. Further consideration will be given to place based problem solving through the Safer Towns and Communities review, plus through the children's services Youth Strategy.

<b>3</b>	<b><i>CSP Priority Area Lead updates</i></b>	
3.1	<i>Communities and cohesion – Paula Grant</i>	
3.1.1	The quarter two priority update paper was circulated in advance.	
3.1.2	There are three areas of focus: engagement, consultation and collaboration to understand what our communities want and need; empowering resident-led groups to build resilient neighbourhoods; and enhancing our rural offer.	
3.1.2	Headlines: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Karl Elliot leads on this priority in conjunction with neighbourhood forums and community groups.</li> <li>▪ Actively engaging with existing NHW groups but particularly with rural groups due to funding from National Lottery to address pockets of deprivation within those areas.</li> <li>▪ Products include ‘Keeping Older People Safe’ (KOPS) guide, and scams awareness and briefings (funded by PCC).</li> <li>▪ Methodology is to connect with communities through a community-led activity and then engaging on community safety issues and activities whilst there.</li> <li>▪ Networking with professional partners, community groups and individuals to cascade messages down.</li> </ul>	
3.1.3	Illustrations of successes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ KOPS – stay safe guide developed during covid as an accessible single-source guide which was distributed during vaccination sessions. Multiple funding sources have been sought to ensure this has been updated and distributed through Age UK, Friendship at Home etc. Also working with the Arms House Associations, NELC Warm Spaces, and Household Support Grant to produce a monthly newsletter and warm packs to reach isolated, lonely older people who may be more vulnerable to crime.</li> <li>▪ Micro-hub in North Cleethorpes – connecting with all community elements including residents and retail to engage with community safety advice and crime prevention tools, using a mixed funding model to ensure sustainability. This is being led by community voice and links to other local drop-in spots.</li> </ul>	
3.1.4	The board congratulates VANEL for keeping such successful community projects and engagement running, with and on behalf of our residents, despite volunteer and funding difficulties.

3.2.6	<p><u>NTE</u></p>
3.2.7	<p>The CSP received notification that the NTE bid submitted into the PCC’s CSP project pot was successful subject to a number of conditions. This will allow us to commence the following initiatives:</p>
3.2.8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Drug safes in licenced premises</li> <li>▪ Drink spiking kits</li> <li>▪ Naloxone provision and overdose response training</li> <li>▪ Street marshals in Cleethorpes over Christmas</li> </ul>
3.2.9	<p>Op Yuletide is running over Christmas and includes plain clothes officers conducting Ask for Angela checks, asking premises for drink spiking test kits etc plus the traditional NTE policing offer with dedicated sergeant. Neighbourhood policing will carry out early evening meet and greet.</p>

Making this option more appealing and available to customers over the Christmas period, Dry January and beyond.</p> <p>Plans to develop NTE group further include writing a comms strategy, community engagement around NTE policing, and developing a problem orientated approach to create an OSARA around premises with the greatest disorder in and outside.</p> <p>We will also give consideration to Leicester Police’s NTE model and Thames Valley Police’s Op Vigilant. These incorporate VAWG recommendations similar to our Op Contract. This currently runs only during the summer and Yuletide periods but we will try to embed it as normal business once a month through the NTE POP.</p>	
<p>3.3</p>	<p><i>Serious and organised crime (Clear Hold Build) – Paul Caswell</i></p>	
<p>3.3.1</p> <p>3.3.2</p> <p>3.3.3</p>	<p>Clear and Hold to become normal business, with focus on Build. This has a multi-agency group to develop community engagement and activity and good political support.</p> <p>Two areas of focus are Nunsthorpe in Bloom and the Community Partnership Intelligence form, with three years of CSP funding to support the priority.</p> <p>Problem profile in relation to young people is being developed by the CSP analyst, and a press release is planned to promote our achievements.</p>	
<p>3.4</p>	<p><i>Safer NEL update and risk escalation – Rebecca Freeman &amp; Paul Caswell</i></p>	
<p>3.4.1</p> <p>3.4.2</p> <p>3.4.3</p>	<p>An update was presented on the four CSP priority areas, plus place based problem solving and individual risk.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ ASB and seasonal responses are in order.</li> <li>▪ Following the youth ASB issues in Grant Thorold Park in February a lot of partnership work has taken place. The CSP analyst has reviewed the data between February and to date and all crime in East Marsh has reduced substantially.</li> <li>▪ Reduction in shop theft, although issues continue in specific premises.</li> </ul> <p>An update was provided on the Winter of action plans. This follows the model of the summer plan for towns and collates the response for Grimsby Town Centre, Freeman Street and Cleethorpes seafront, focusing specifically on ASB, retail crime, NTE and VAWG. Two days of action have taken place already with successful outcomes – these will continue throughout the winter season.</p>	

3.4.4	Other agenda items discussed included closer working with Project Phoenix to further develop support for short sentence prison leavers; the Community Alcohol Partnership which focuses on educating young people, parents and retailers around underage sales and drinking; the PSPO review to include an additional PSPO for nuisance motorbikes; and retail crime. No matters were proposed for escalation to this board, although an update on vape shops has been included on this agenda for information.	
<b>4</b>	<b><i>Standing items</i></b>	
4.1	<i>Finance and resourcing – Rebecca Freeman</i>	
4.1.1	The finance paper was circulated in advance.	
4.1.2	Expenditure has been apportioned across the operating costs and delivery plan as agreed, with no anticipated underspend at present. This will continue to be monitored as spend progresses throughout the financial year against budget.	
4.1.3	The CSP received notification from the PCC that both the NTE bid (subject to grant conditions) and the Operation Yellowfin bids were successful. There are, however, uncertainties around CSP funding following the announcement in November 2025 of the national abolition of PCCs.	
4.1.4	There are two proposed models – firstly, a mayoral model with deputy mayor for policing. However, as our police force is not coterminous with the mayoral authority we will be in an alternative arrangement of a policing board of two mayors plus four council leaders. They will appoint a lead for policing and crime. Two questions remain – whether the deputy mayor / political appointment will have the same powers as the current PCC; and who will control the police budget. A white paper is due to be published after Christmas.	
4.1.5	Finally, a briefing note has been circulated from Public Health expressing a reluctance to continue sole financial support for domestic abuse related death reviews and the board was asked to agree a way forward for the onward funding of these statutory reviews.

4.2	<i>DARDRs – Rebecca Freeman</i>	
4.2.1	<u>New cases for consideration</u>	
4.2.2	Following agreement at the September board <b>Adult HC</b> is currently with the Home Office for approval not to conduct a full DARDR. Preliminary discussions have been held with the Suicide Prevention Coordinator to develop an internal learning review should a formal review not be required.

Permission has been granted not to publish the full report due to sensitivities around the victim's children.</p> <p>The reviews for <b>Adult SG</b> and <b>Adult GM</b> are underway.</p> <p>Three completed reviews have actions still outstanding (<b>Adult AK, Adult CB</b> and <b>Adult TM</b>).</p> <p>Additionally, NEL CSP is supporting two reviews being undertaken by Bradford and Lincolnshire CSPs.</p> <p><u>Learning</u></p> <p>Delivery of action plans and dissemination of learning is now the responsibility of the Domestic Abuse Operational Group.</p> <p>Kay Durrant, supported by a graduate research assistant, has been commissioned by the OPCC to review DARDR shared learning across Humberside. Updates will be provided following the inaugural meeting in January.</p> <p><u>DAC oversight pilot</u></p> <p>No new updates have been released.</p>	<p>8</p>
<p>4.3</p>	<p><i>ASB Case reviews – Paul Caswell / Rebecca Freeman</i></p>	
<p>4.3.1</p> <p>4.3.2</p>	<p>NELC engaged with ASB Help and gained accreditation a number of years ago and our victim policy and practice are now being adopted across the Humber. We have a victim champion in place to deal with all ASB medium and high risk cases – currently with 27 open cases.</p> <p>A request for an ASB case review appeal has been received by the CSP board. The process requires that an independent officer is appointed on behalf of the CSP to conduct this as a desktop exercise, reviewing both the case documents and the complainant's appeal submission.</p>	

4.3.3	In this case Laura Booth was appointed as the independent reviewer. She examined the thorough response that had originally been returned on conclusion of the case review and concluded the original outcome to be upheld.	
4.3.4	<b>ACTION:</b> RF to send response to ASB case review appeal on behalf of the CSP board.	9
4.4	<i>Communications and good news stories – Rebecca Freeman</i>	
4.4.1	The CSP newsletter was circulated in advance. The board approved this for wider dissemination. RF reiterated her ongoing request for future stories to be submitted to her for inclusion.	
4.4.2	RF demonstrated the CSP communications and activity tracker and requested input from partners as appropriate.	
4.4.3	The board congratulated Creative Start who won the inaugural 2025 Investors in People award for excellence in building purpose driven impact.	
4.4.4	<b>ACTION:</b> RF to finalise CSP newsletter and circulate.	10
4.6	<i>Any other business – by exception</i>	
4.6.1	All work under the Safer Streets High Street Accelerator and Green Spaces Fund of £750k has now been completed as demonstrated by the floral walls, planters, pop up garden and festoon lights in Grimsby Town Centre. North East Lincolnshire was selected from ten areas to develop a case study as the area as been identified as national best practice.	
4.6.2	The OPCC is launching their “Just Don’t” campaign next week aimed at men and boys to reduce harassment.	
4.6.3	Community payback have repaired, varnished and painted the benches from the North Prom to boating lake. The CSP would like to record thanks for the effort that went into improving the aesthetics of this area for our residents and visitors.
