EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A report advising of proposed changes to places on Committees, Panels and Outside Bodies of the Council since the Annual Meeting held on 21st May, 2026.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- (1) That Councillor Mayne replace Councillor K. Batson as a full member of the Health and Adult Social Care Scrutiny Panel and Councillor K. Batson be appointed as a substitute member of the Health and Adult Social Care Scrutiny Panel.
- (2) That it be noted that the Leader of the Council has changed his appointments to the Health and Well Being Board to replace himself with Councillor Henderson
- (3) That Councillor Morland replace Councillor Patrick as the Labour Group's representative on the Humber Police and Crime Panel.
- (4) That Councillor Sawkins replace Councillor P Batson as a substitute member for Councillor Freeston on the Greater Lincolnshire Mayoral Combined Authority.
- (5) That Councillor N. Oliver be removed as the Reform UK Group's substitute member of the Greater Lincolnshire Mayoral Combined Authority Scrutiny Committee.

REASONS FOR DECISION

Appointments to seats on the Council's Committees, Panels and Outside Bodies are determined by full Council at its Annual Meeting. Any changes following these formal appointments are notified to full Council for formal approval.

1. BACKGROUND AND ISSUES

1.1 At the Annual Meeting of Council on 21st May, 2026, appointments were made to the committees and panels of the Council. Since that meeting, the Reform UK Group has requested the following changes:

- Health and Adult Social Care Scrutiny Panel – Councillor Mayne to replace Councillor K. Batson as a full member, with Councillor K. Batson to be appointed as a substitute member.
- Health and Well Being Board – Councillor Henderson to replace Councillor Freeston as a full member. Appointment of Elected Members to the Health and Well Being Board is a decision reserved for the Leader of the Council. The Leader has requested that this change be made and Council is therefore asked to note this change.

1.2 At the Annual Meeting of Council on 21st May, 2026, appointments were made to Outside Bodies. Since that meeting, requests have been received to make the following changes:

- Humber Police and Crime Panel – Councillor Morland to replace Councillor Patrick as a full member.
- Greater Lincolnshire Mayoral Combined Authority – Councillor Sawkins to replace Councillor P Batson as a substitute member for Councillor Freeston.
- Greater Lincolnshire Mayoral Combined Authority Scrutiny Committee – Councillor N. Oliver to be removed as a substitute member as he is listed as a substitute member for Councillor Grice on the Greater Lincolnshire Mayoral Combined Authority. He cannot be a substitute member on the Combined Authority Executive and also be a substitute member of the Combined Authority scrutiny function.
