CONTRIBUTION TO OUR AIMS

The Council has two clear strategic priorities – stronger economy and stronger communities. Having better polling districts and polling places will enable more electors the opportunity to engage in local and national democracy.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report seeks approval to commence a review of polling districts, polling places and polling stations, and to agree the proposed timetable and consultation approach. The review is required to implement the new Immingham Town Council warding arrangements and the minor Barnoldby le Beck and Waltham parish boundary change, so that the electoral register published on 1st December 2026 reflects these changes ahead of the May 2027 elections. It will also allow comments on polling arrangements across the borough, including accessibility and equality considerations. Council is asked to approve the current and proposed polling stations as the basis for consultation and to agree the delegations set out in the recommendations.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. That a review of polling district and polling places commences on Friday 31st July 2026.
2. That the proposed timetable at paragraph 1.11 contained within this report, be approved.
3. That the current and proposed polling stations, incorporating the comments of the Returning Officer, detailed at appendix 1 of this report, be used as the basis of the consultation.
4. That power to designate polling districts in accordance with section 18 and 18A of the Representation of the People Act 1983 is delegated to the Chief Executive and Electoral Registration Officer.
5. That power to designate polling places in accordance with section 18 and 18B of the Representation of the People Act 1983 is delegated to the Chief Executive, and for such power to be exercised only where necessary, when a decision is required at short notice to secure lawful and effective electoral arrangements, and it is not possible to await a decision of Council.

REASONS FOR DECISION

Under the Representation of the People Act 1983, the council has a duty to divide its area into polling districts and to designate a polling place for each district. This review is required to ensure that the Council's polling districts and polling places reflect approved parish and town council boundary and warding changes before the electoral register is published on 1st December 2026. The review will also provide an opportunity to consider whether existing polling arrangements remain suitable, accessible and convenient for electors, and to consult on any proposed changes before final recommendations are brought back to Council.

1. BACKGROUND AND ISSUES

- 1.1. North East Lincolnshire Council undertook a Parish Council Community Governance Review in 2023/24, ahead of the anticipated Ward Boundary Review. The outcome of that review was considered and agreed by Council on 12th March 2024.
- 1.2. The Council resolved:
 - To support option 2 (move five properties from Waltham parish to Barnoldby Le Beck parish) for the proposed new parish boundary between Waltham and Barnoldby Le Beck parish councils, with Bradley Road made the new parish boundary with effect from the May 2027 parish council elections.
 - That the Electoral Registration Officer be asked to incorporate the changes to Immingham Town Ward boundaries and Barnoldby Le Beck and Waltham parish boundaries into the electoral registers to be published on 1st December 2026.
 - That the Returning Officer be asked to implement the changes to the parish boundaries at the next full Parish Council elections in May 2027.
- 1.3. Due to Local Government Reorganisation, the Local Government Boundary Commission for England has placed North East Lincolnshire Council's Ward Boundary Review on hold.
- 1.4. Although the statutory compulsory review period has concluded, a further targeted review is required to ensure that polling districts and polling places reflect approved parish and town council boundary changes before the revised register is published.
- 1.5. The Electoral Registration Officer must ensure that the new boundaries for Immingham Town Council, together with the minor alteration affecting Barnoldby le Beck and Waltham Parish, are reflected in the register published on 1st December 2026.

- 1.6. Each town or parish ward must form its own polling district. As a result, the polling districts for Immingham must be revised to reflect the new town council warding arrangements.
- 1.7. The primary purpose of this review of polling districts, polling places and polling stations is therefore to meet the legal requirement to implement the new boundaries for Immingham Town Council. The Returning Officer also welcomes comments, concerns or suggested improvements relating to polling arrangements in any other polling district as part of the consultation process.
- 1.8. There is no prescribed length for the review period, provided that all steps required by legislation are completed within it.

The Review Process

- 1.9. Guidance for the conduct of the review has been published by the Electoral Commission. The following stages are recommended:

Stage 1 – Notification of the Review

This is the formal commencement of the review and requires the local authority to give notice of the holding of the review. The notice must be displayed at the local authority's office, and in at least one conspicuous place within the authority. It must also be displayed on the Council's website.

Stage 2 – Consultation on the Review

This stage is when the Council considers representations received and forms its initial proposals. The Returning Officer must comment, at this stage, on all existing polling stations used and any new polling stations which will probably be chosen if the new proposals are accepted by the authority. These are detailed at appendix 1.

Stage 3 – Concluding the Review

After considering all of the representations, the council must decide on the most appropriate polling districts and polling places, which must be approved by Full Council. If the review results in alterations, the Electoral Registration Officer must make the necessary alterations to the electoral register.

Stage 4 – Publishing the conclusion of the Review

Once the final proposals have been agreed, details of the new polling districts and polling places must be made available to the public; and must detail the reasons for choosing each particular district or polling place.

Along with the reasons for the final decision of the review, the following must also be published:

- all correspondence sent to the Returning Officer in connection with the review
- all representations made by any person in connection with the review
- the minutes of any meeting held by the council to consider any revision to the designation of polling districts or polling places within its area as a

result of the review

- details of the designation of polling districts and polling places within its area as a result of the review
- details of the places where the results of the review have been published

1.10. Although the final decision is that of the Council, there is a right of appeal to the Electoral Commission in respect of the outcome of the review.

Proposed Timetable for the Review

1.11. A proposed timetable which mirrors the above stages is set out below:

The Review

1.12. A reasonable methodology must be demonstrated if a successful appeal (with its consequential reputational damage) is to be avoided. The Guidance stresses the need for all decisions made to have been consulted upon and to be measured and practical: "The whole process should be as transparent and open as possible to avoid possible conflict". The initial proposals document sets out the considerations taken into account in drawing up the proposals and such an approach reduces the suggestion that decisions may have been politically motivated.

1.13. The primary considerations for every review are a requirement of Electoral Law and are:-

- The Council must seek to ensure that all electors have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances; and
- The Council must seek to ensure that so far as is reasonable and practicable, every polling place is accessible to electors who are disabled.

1.14. There is no scientific formula or set of rules for the division of a constituency into polling districts, nor for the selection of polling places or polling stations. The choice will often be the balance between a number of competing considerations (e.g. quality of a building and distances between the residents to that building, compared to other options for polling places). Judgement

needs to be exercised (e.g. when comparing the potential disturbance to voters against other factors). However, in carrying out the balancing exercise, the approach should be voter-centred.

1.15. Officers propose to use the following criteria for the review:-

- Disparities between polling districts to make them more comparable in terms of number of polling places and the number of electors per polling place;
- Current levels of satisfaction / dissatisfaction as expressed by or on behalf of electors;
- The cost / elector ratio of providing a polling place, so there is a broad comparability between districts;
- The availability of postal votes on demand;
- Disturbance to electors which would be caused by alteration of polling places which have been used for a long period of time;
- A polling place should be in its own polling district, unless it is not possible to find a suitable place in the district;
- There should not be major barriers between the voters and their polling place. Major roads, rivers and the like can therefore be considered as starting points for polling district boundaries unless there is good quality, accessible crossing points;
- The polling place should not be difficult to locate and should be close to where most of the electors in the polling district live;
- The topography of the area should be taken into account including availability of public transport for electors having to travel distances to the polling place;
- That each parish should be a separate polling district save in exceptional circumstances;
- If there appears to be a need in all or particular elections (considering, for example, UK Parliamentary elections may have a higher turnout than local government elections) for multiple polling stations in a polling place, it will need to be considered if the polling place can accommodate them;
- Capability of the polling place to cope with peaks of electors allocated to it.

1.16. It should be noted that the considerations are not weighted, as proposals need to be voter-centred and the exercise of judgment and the balancing exercise needs to have this at the forefront of consideration. Each proposal/representation will have circumstances peculiar to it and the differing considerations relating to those circumstances must be balanced to allow the outcome to be voter centred.

2. RISKS, OPPORTUNITIES AND EQUALITY ISSUES

2.1 On conclusion of any polling district and polling places review, the Electoral Commission can consider representations that the review process has not been conducted correctly. There are two grounds on which a representation may state that a local authority has failed to conduct a proper review, namely:

- the local authority has failed to meet the reasonable requirements of

electors in the constituency; or

- the local authority has failed to take sufficient account of the accessibility of polling places for disabled electors.

- 2.2 If an appeal is upheld, the Electoral Commission may direct alterations to polling places. This presents a legal and reputational risk to the Council if the review is not carried out transparently, if consultation is not meaningful, or if accessibility and equality considerations are not properly evidenced.
- 2.3 Equality considerations are central to the review. The Council must have due regard to its responsibilities under the Equality Act 2010, including the Public Sector Equality Duty, when exercising its functions. This includes considering how proposed polling arrangements may affect people with protected characteristics, particularly disabled electors, older people, pregnant electors, people with caring responsibilities, and those who may face barriers linked to language, literacy, mobility, transport or confidence in accessing public services.
- 2.4 The review provides an opportunity to identify and reduce barriers to voting. In assessing polling places and polling stations, officers will consider matters such as step-free access, parking and drop-off arrangements, public transport links, internal space and layout, lighting, signage, the availability of seating, the suitability of low-level polling booths, privacy for voters requiring assistance, and whether any temporary adjustments or alternative venues are required.
- 2.5 There are positive equality opportunities arising from the review, including improving the accessibility and convenience of polling arrangements, strengthening public confidence in the electoral process, and supporting electors to vote independently and in secret wherever reasonably practicable. Any equality issues identified through the review will be considered alongside the statutory requirements, operational feasibility and the need to provide reasonable facilities for all electors.

3. OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

- 3.1 It is a legal requirement to undertake this review.

4. REPUTATION AND COMMUNICATIONS CONSIDERATIONS

- 4.1 The review requires the local authority to consult with a wide range of stakeholders as set out in regulations and allow sufficient time for consultation. This will be achieved by an open consultation period whereby any comments on the current arrangements will be welcomed. Failure to abide by this duty could lead to an appeal to the Electoral Commission, as set out in Section 2, which could lead to reputational damage to the authority if the appeal is upheld.

5. FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

- 5.1 There will be minimal financial costs involved in undertaking the review.

6. CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE IMPLICATIONS

- 6.1 There are no children and young people implications arising from this report.

7. CLIMATE CHANGE, NATURE RECOVERY AND ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

- 7.1 There are no climate change or environmental implications arising from the recommendations in this report.

8. PUBLIC HEALTH, HEALTH INEQUALITIES AND MARMOT IMPLICATIONS

- 8.1 The recommendations in this report do not create direct public health implications. However, access to democratic participation is an important element of inclusive and healthy communities. The review of polling districts, polling places and polling stations provides an opportunity to consider whether polling arrangements support all electors to participate independently, safely and with confidence, particularly those who may experience barriers linked to disability, age, mobility, transport, caring responsibilities, language, literacy, deprivation or digital exclusion.
- 8.2 Health inequalities are influenced by the wider social determinants of health, including access to services, transport, community infrastructure, confidence, and the ability of people to have control over decisions that affect their lives. The Marmot approach emphasises the importance of creating healthy and sustainable places and communities, enabling people to maximise their capabilities and have control over their lives, and applying proportionate universalism so that universal services are accessible to all, with additional consideration given where need or disadvantage is greater.
- 8.3 In the context of this review, the Marmot implications are therefore linked to reducing avoidable barriers to voting and ensuring that polling arrangements are as accessible and convenient as reasonably practicable. Consideration will be given to the location of polling places, physical accessibility, public transport links, parking and drop-off arrangements, signage, internal layout, availability of seating, and the suitability of facilities for electors who may need additional support. This will help ensure that the review supports fair access to the democratic process and does not inadvertently widen existing inequalities.
- 8.4 Any issues identified through consultation, local knowledge or accessibility assessment will be considered alongside the statutory requirements, operational feasibility and the Council's equality duties. This approach is consistent with the wider aim of supporting stronger communities by enabling residents, including those who may be more likely to experience health inequalities, to participate in civic life.

9. CONSULTATION WITH SCRUTINY

- 9.1 All elected members will be invited to partake in the consultation period and feedback any concerns or suggestions for consideration.

10. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 10.1 As outlined within section 5, there are minimal costs that would result from the consultation process.

11. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 11.1 The Council is required under the Representation of the People Act 1983 to divide its area into polling districts and to designate polling places for those districts. In carrying out a review the Council must follow the statutory process set out in Schedule A1 to the 1983 Act, including publication of notice, consultation, consideration of representations and publication of the outcome.
- 11.2 The proposed review is necessary to ensure that polling districts and polling places reflect the approved Immingham Town Council warding arrangements and the Barnoldby le Beck/Waltham parish boundary change in time for the revised electoral register to be published on 1st December 2026 and ahead of the scheduled May 2027 elections.
- 11.3 The proposed timetable and consultation approach are intended to ensure that the review is carried out transparently and in accordance with the statutory requirements. Failure to follow the correct process, or to give proper consideration to accessibility and elector convenience, could give rise to challenge or representations to the Electoral Commission.

12. HUMAN RESOURCES IMPLICATIONS

- 12.1 There are no HR implications directly arising from the report.

13. WARD IMPLICATIONS

- 13.1 The proposals contained within this report will, if agreed, affect all wards; however the main implication will be in Immingham Ward.

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Introduction

North East Lincolnshire Council is reviewing its polling districts, polling places and polling stations to ensure that arrangements remain suitable, accessible and convenient for electors. The review will consider whether existing polling district boundaries are still appropriate, whether polling places provide suitable locations for polling stations, and whether current polling stations continue to meet the needs of voters, polling staff and the Returning Officer.

The schedules that follow show the current arrangements for each polling district, including the polling place, electorate figures and polling station. The principal focus of this review is the creation of new polling districts required for Immingham Town Council. However, the Returning Officer also welcomes comments, observations or suggestions for improvement on polling arrangements across the borough. The Returning Officer's comments are included to draw attention to any known issues, proposed changes or areas where alternative venues or revised arrangements may need to be considered.

A Parish Council Community Governance Review was completed in March 2024. As part of that review, it was resolved that new town council boundaries would be introduced for Immingham Town Council, creating a north and south split along Pelham Road. New polling districts must therefore be designed before those boundaries are implemented in the electoral register to be published on 1 December 2026. Comments are invited on the proposed arrangements to help ensure that the new polling districts and associated polling places are clear, practical and appropriate for electors.
