## NORTH EAST LINCOLNSHIRE BOROUGH COUNCIL

### PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER 2026

#### IMMINGHAM TOWN CENTRE

This Order is made by North East Lincolnshire Borough Council (the Council) in exercise of its power under Section 59 and Section 63 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 (the Act).

- 1) The Order applies to the public areas shown on the map annexed to this Order (the Restricted Area).
- 2) The Council is satisfied that the two conditions below have been met, in that:
  - a) activities carried on in the Restricted Area have had a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality, or it is likely that these activities will be carried on in the public place and they will have such an effect, and;
  - b) the effect, or likely effect, of the activities is, or is likely to be, of a persistent or continuing nature, is, or is likely to be, such as to make the activities unreasonable, and justifies the restrictions imposed by the Order.
- 3) This Order shall have effect for a period of 3 years, commencing on 10<sup>th</sup> June 2026 and remaining in force until 9<sup>th</sup> June 2029.

#### **Anti-social Behaviour**

- 4) The effect of this Order is to impose the following prohibitions under Section 59 of the Act:
  - a) Engaging in any activity or behaviour that causes, or is likely to cause nuisance, alarm, harassment, distress or intimidation to any other person.
  - b) Cycling or propelling a bicycle in any manner other than walking with it by any person along Kennedy Way, Immingham.
  - c) Using a skateboard, scooter, rollerblades or similar wheeled devices in such a manner that incorporates any street fixture or street furniture.
  - d) Engaging in any activity or behaviour that threatens the safety of that person or any other person.
  - e) Using foul or abusive language directed towards any other person.
  - f) Playing music or generating noise at a volume, or in a manner, likely to cause a nuisance.
  - g) Climbing onto any structure or building other than for a lawful purpose.

- 5) The effect of this Order is to impose the following requirement in relation to Section 4 of the Order:

Where a Police Constable or an Authorised Officer has reasonable grounds to believe that a person or group is engaging, or has engaged in any activity prohibited by this Order, that officer may require the person or group to immediately disperse from the Restricted Area for a period of up to 24 hours, as specified by the officer.

- 6) Any person who, without reasonable excuse, fails to comply with any of the prohibitions or requirements under Section 4 of the Order commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (currently £1000).

### **Alcohol**

- 7) The effect of this Order is to impose the following prohibitions under Section 63 of the Act:

- a) Continuing to consume alcohol or anything reasonably believed to be alcohol when asked to desist by a Police Constable or Authorised Officer.
- b) Failing to surrender alcohol or anything reasonably believed to be alcohol in their possession when asked to do so by a Police Constable or Authorised Officer.

This provision does not apply to alcohol being consumed within the premises licensed under the Licensing Act 2003 or in accordance with a permission granted under Section 115(e) of the Highways Act 1980.

- 8) The effect of this Order is to impose the following requirement in relation to the prohibitions in Section 7 of the Order:

Where a Police Constable or an Authorised Officer reasonably believes that a person or group is in possession of alcohol and that its consumption is causing or is likely to cause anti-social behaviour, they may require immediate surrender of the alcohol and may dispose of it in any manner they deem appropriate.

- 9) Any person who, without reasonable excuse, fails to comply with any of the prohibitions or requirements under Section 7 of the Order, commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale (currently £500).
- 10) A Police Constable or Authorised Officer may issue a fixed penalty notice to any person whom they believe has committed an offence under this Order. The recipient of such a notice will have 14 days to pay the fixed penalty of £100. Failure to pay the fixed penalty within this period may result in prosecution.
- 11) Any challenge to this Order must be made at the High Court within 6 weeks of it being made by someone who lives in, regularly works in or visits the Restricted Area.

The validity of the Order may be challenged on two grounds, that:

- a) The Council acted beyond its powers in making the Order or including provisions; or
- b) The Council failed to comply with procedural requirements prescribed by The Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014.

When an application is made, the High Court may decide to suspend the operation of the Order, in whole or in part, pending its decision. The High Court has the authority to uphold, quash, or vary the Order.
