

The North East Lincolnshire Borough Council (Prohibition of Waiting Restrictions) (Various Streets) (No 25-01) Order 2026

Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and regulation 7 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996

Notice is hereby given that on 19th August 2026 North East Lincolnshire Borough Council made the above Traffic Regulation Order under powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ('the Act') the effect of which will be to: -

1. Introduce "24 Hour Prohibition of Waiting" restrictions at the following locations:

- Buller Street junction with Weelsby Street South, Grimsby (in part)
- Carr Lane junction with Cooper Road, Grimsby (in part)
- Conyers Avenue, Grimsby (in part)
- Douglas Road junction with Laurier Road, Cleethorpes (in part)
- Fairfield Road junction with Waltham Road, Grimsby (in part)
- Hardys Road junction with Daggett Road, Cleethorpes (in part)
- Little Michael Street junction with Marshall Avenue, Grimsby (in part)
- Rutland Street junction with Oxford Street, Grimsby (in part)
- Marshall Avenue, Grimsby (in part)
- West Street junction with Charles Street, Cleethorpes (in part)
- Westkirke Avenue, Grimsby (in part)

2. Extend the current "24 Hour Prohibition of Waiting" restrictions at the following locations:

- Heneage Road (near Welholme Academy), Grimsby (in part)
- Victoria Street North, Grimsby (in part)

The Order will come into force on the **11th September 2026**.

If any person wishes to challenge the validity of the Order, or any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirement of the Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
