Dear resident

Waste and Recycling Scheme - Presenting your waste for collection correctly

Residents are asked to adhere to the following points:

- The point of collection will be the 'edge of premises', which is the point where individual properties meet the adopted public highway.
- Wheeled bins and recycling boxes must be made available for collection by 7.00 am on the day of collection.
- Wheeled bins and recycling boxes must not be stored on the public highway (pavement, road or alleyway).
- Wheeled bins and recycling boxes must be returned to your property as soon as possible after collection.
- If collections have not been made on the scheduled date, wheeled bins and recycling boxes should be left out until they are emptied.
- Recyclable items must be separated and placed into the correct recycling boxes.
- Where you have opted into the garden waste service, garden waste must be placed in the brown (or black lidded) wheeled bin and in any event garden waste must not be placed in your general waste wheeled bin.
- Garden waste that is found to be contaminated with other waste materials will not be collected. (i.e. domestic waste green bin)
- The Council will collect waste set out for collection only in the containers provided by the Council to residents for that purpose.
- Unless otherwise specifically agreed as part of the service only waste fully contained in the containers provided will be collected. Excess waste will not be collected.

What is a Section 46 Notice?

A Section 46 notice is a legal notice issued under the Environmental Protection Act 1990.

These may be issued to residents who **regularly** fail to comply with the Waste and Recycling Scheme set out above.
