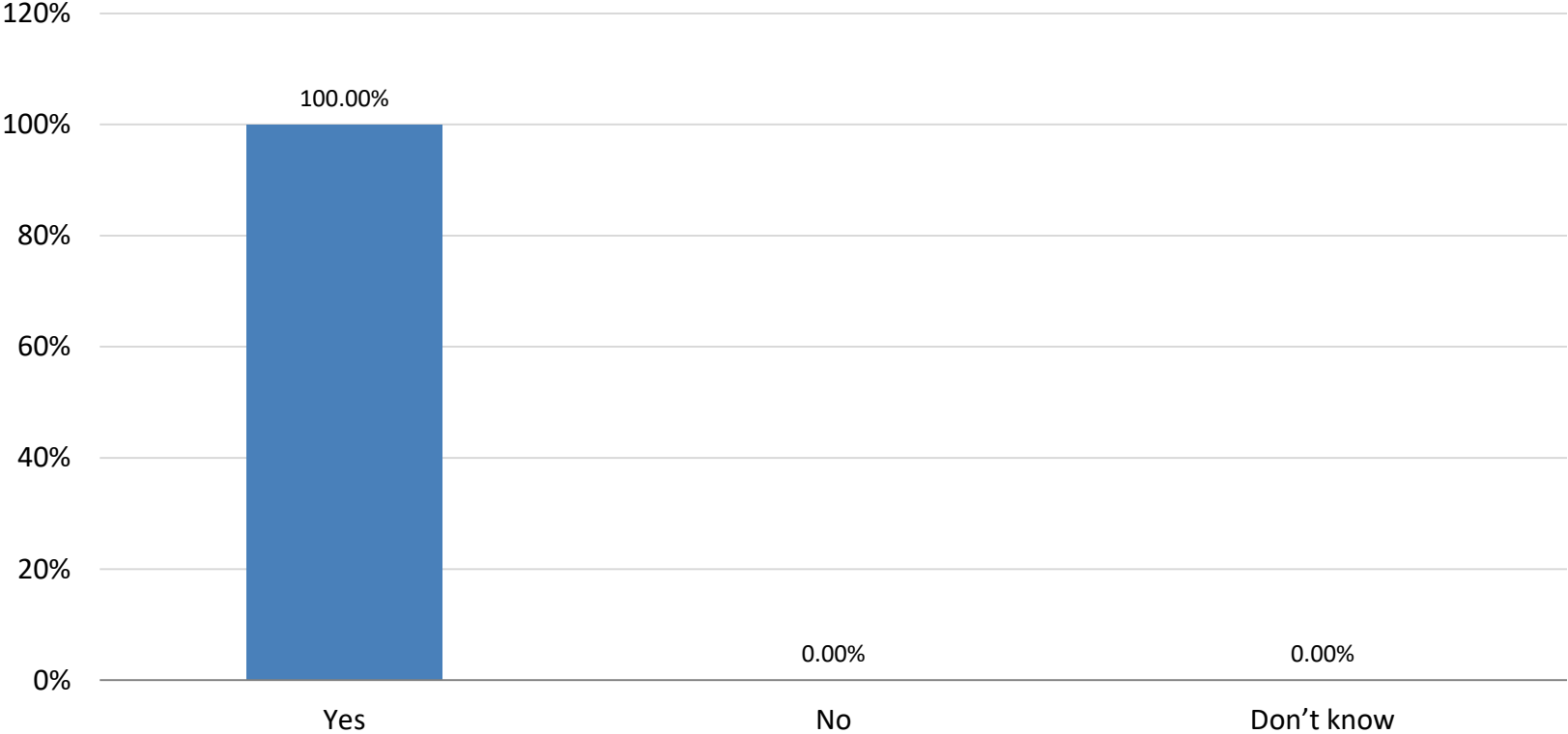

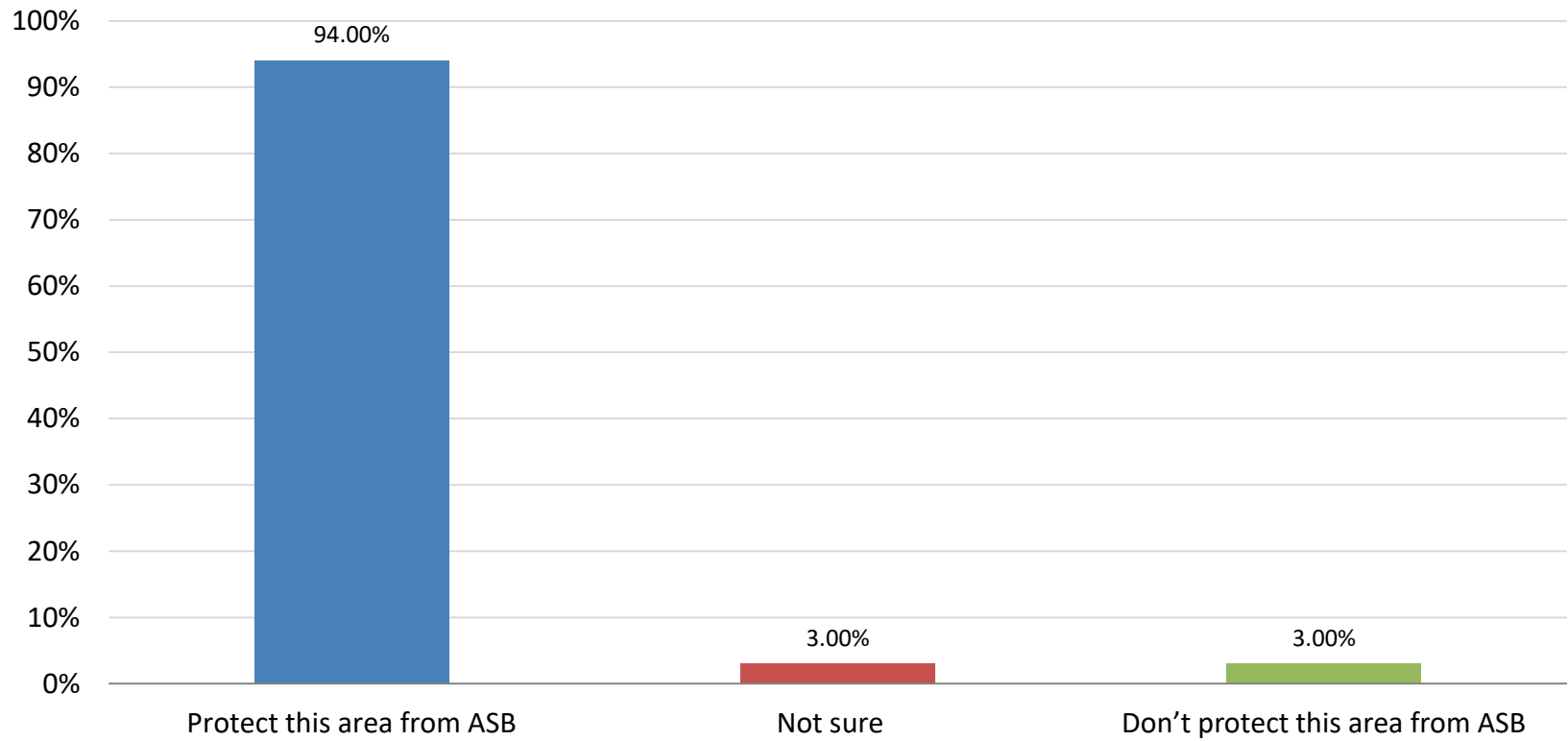
In general, do you believe that public places should be protected from anti-social behaviour (ASB)?



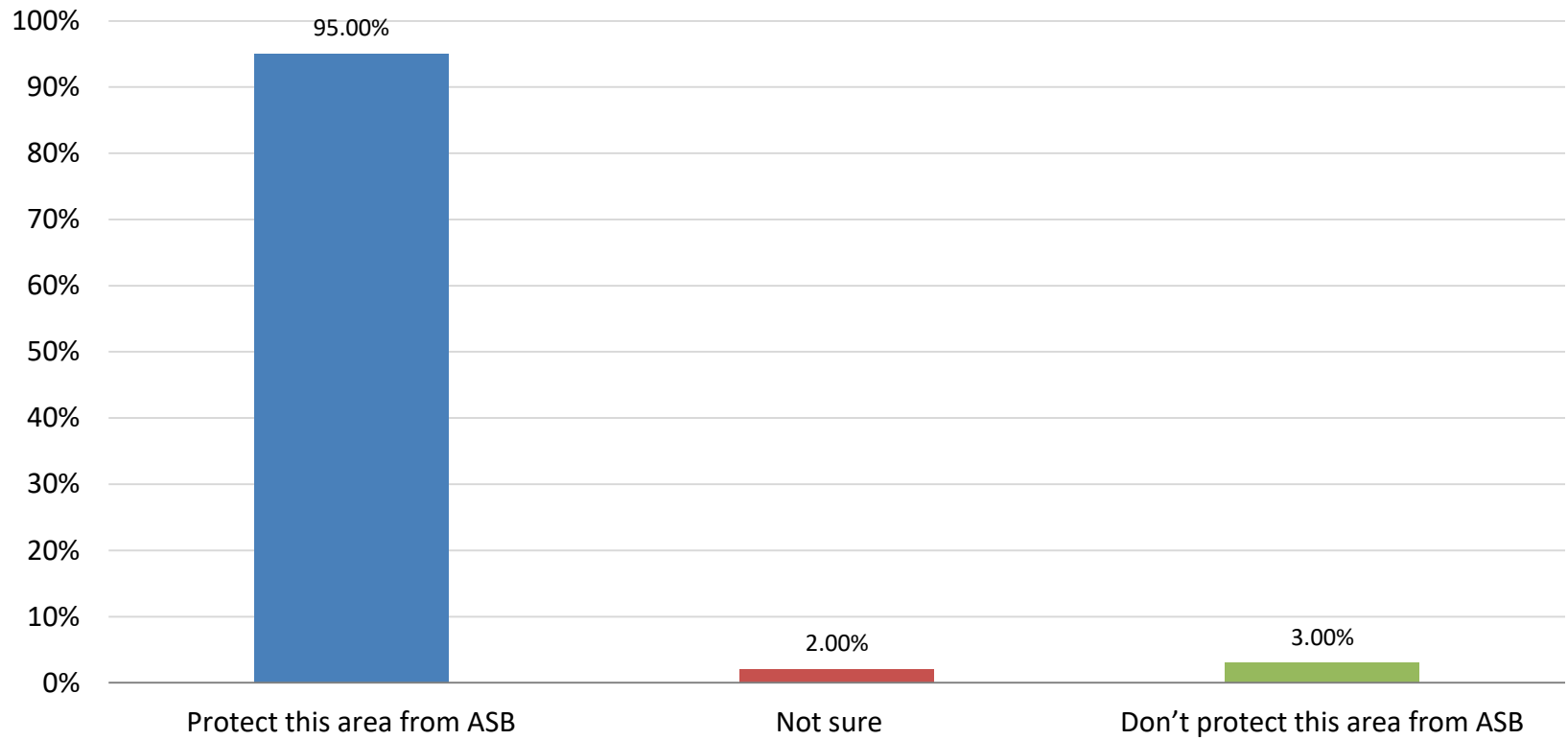

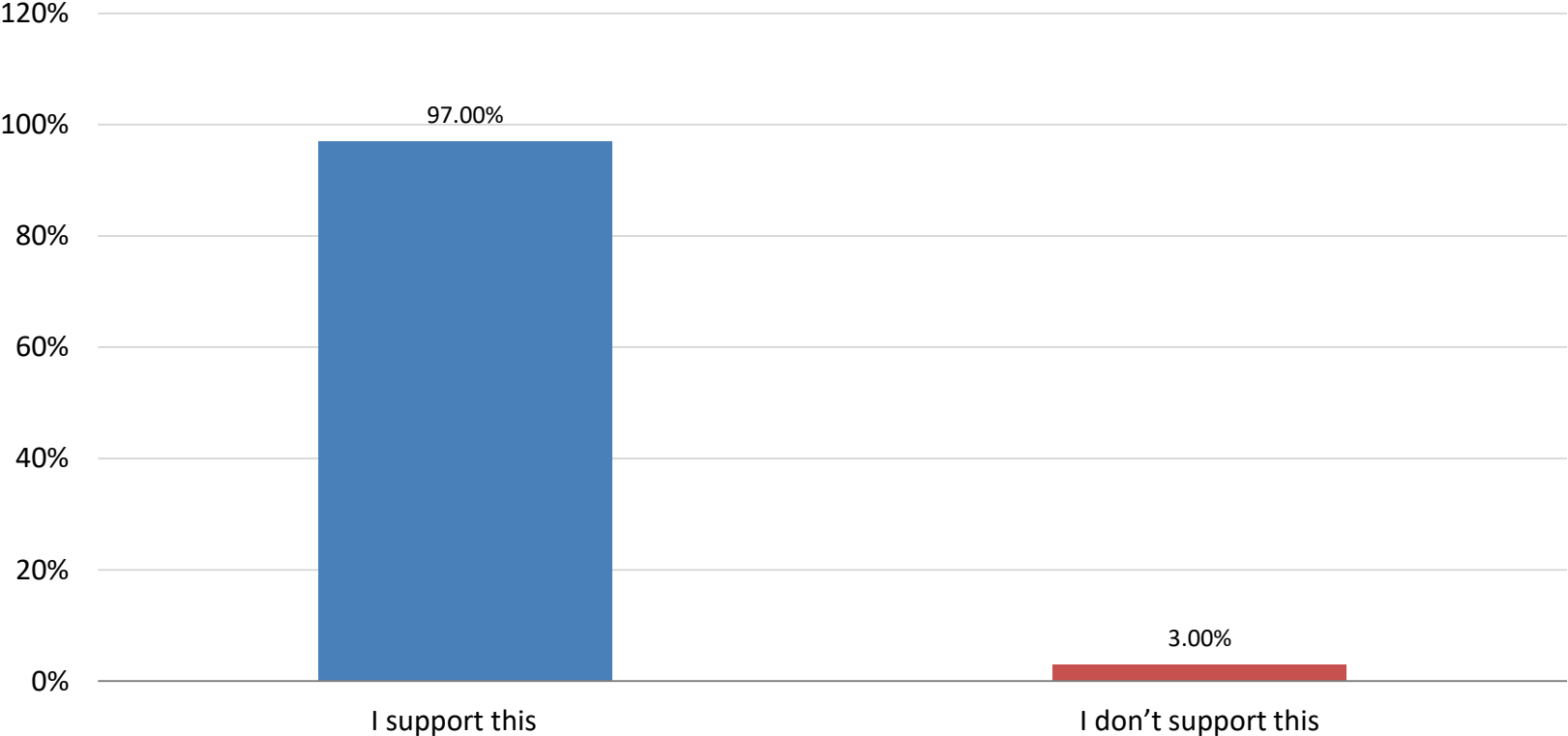
Behaving in a manner that is violent, or threatening, or intimidating, or distressing or annoying



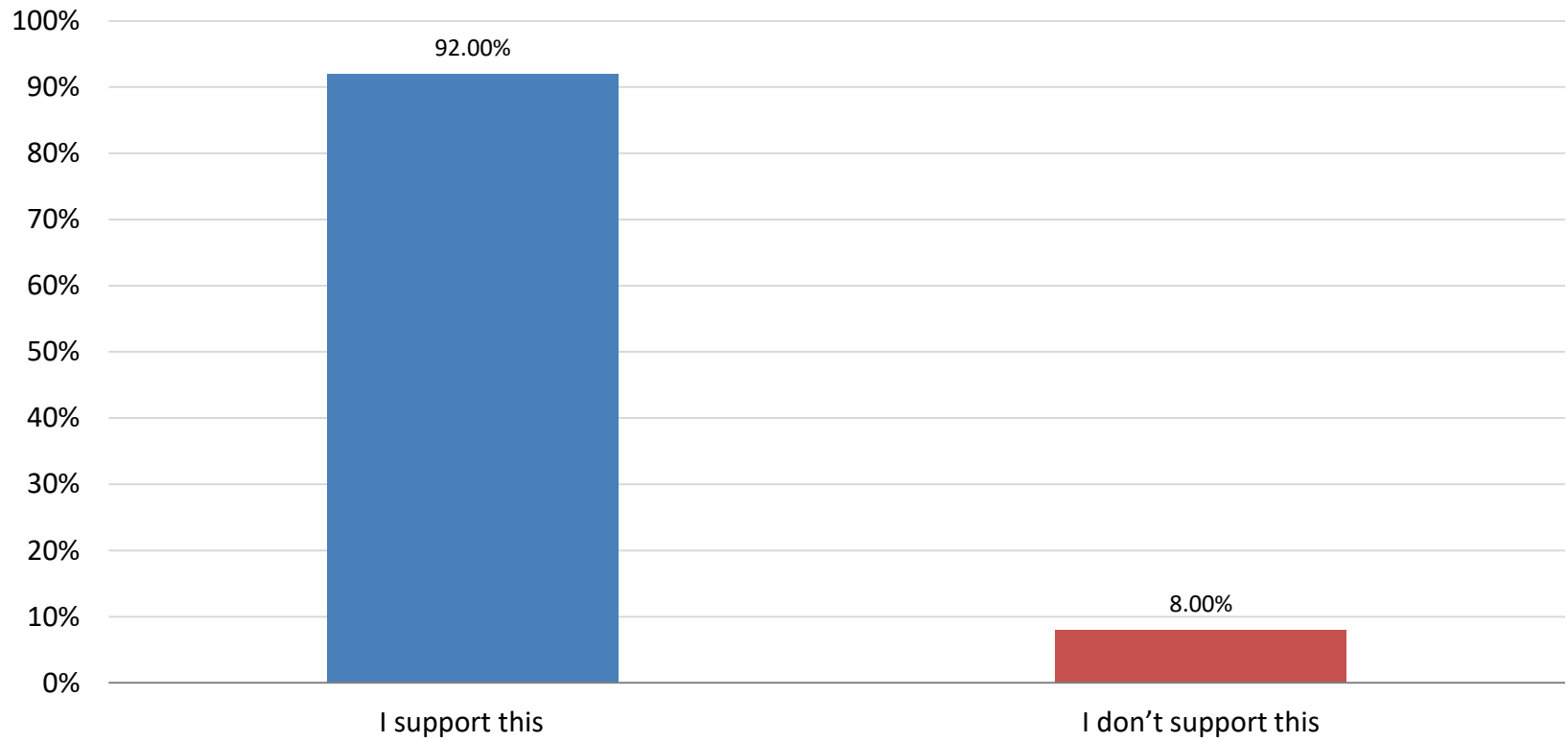
Whilst under the influence of alcohol or any other substance being a threat or a risk to their own personal safety, or the safety of others



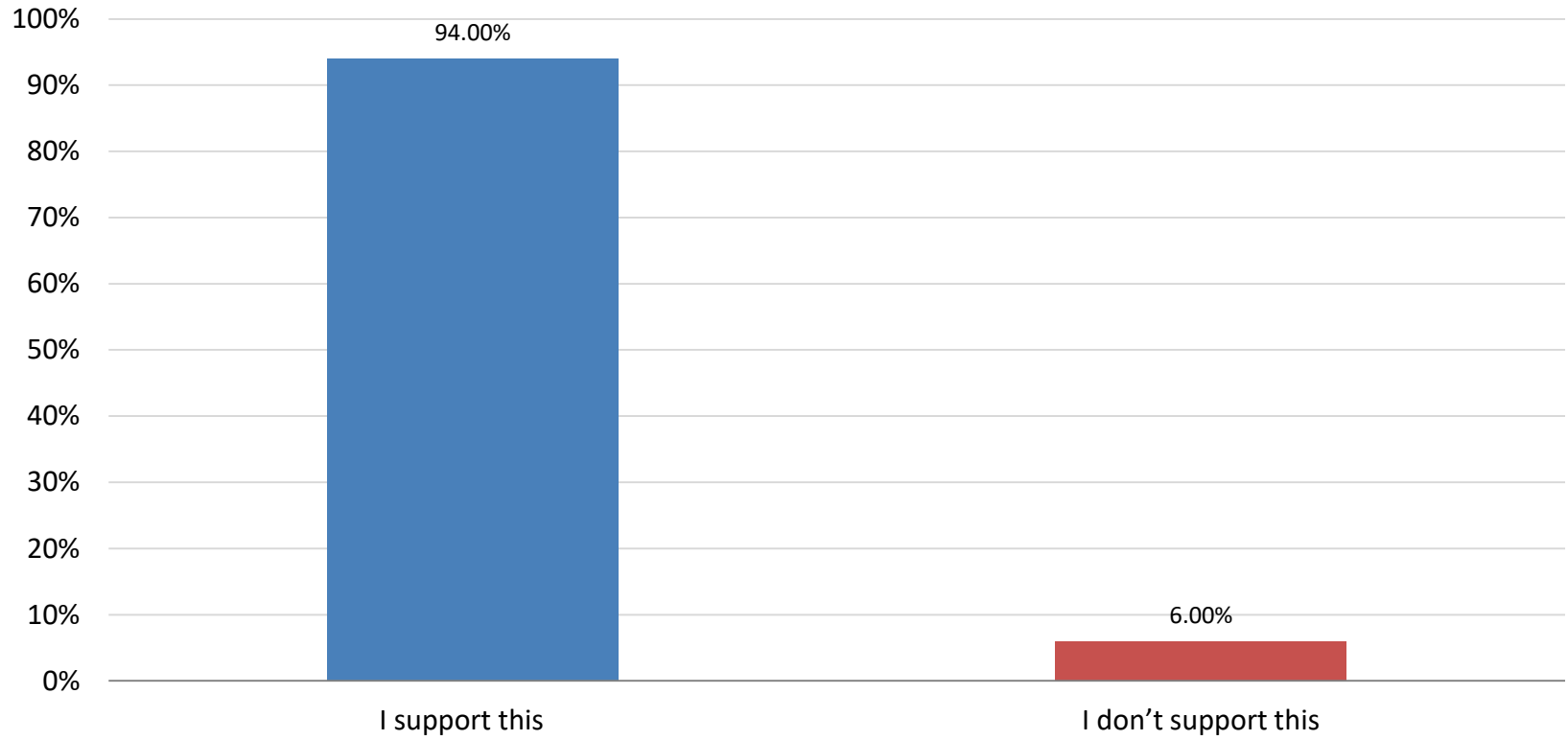
Using foul or abusive language (directed at or towards a third person)



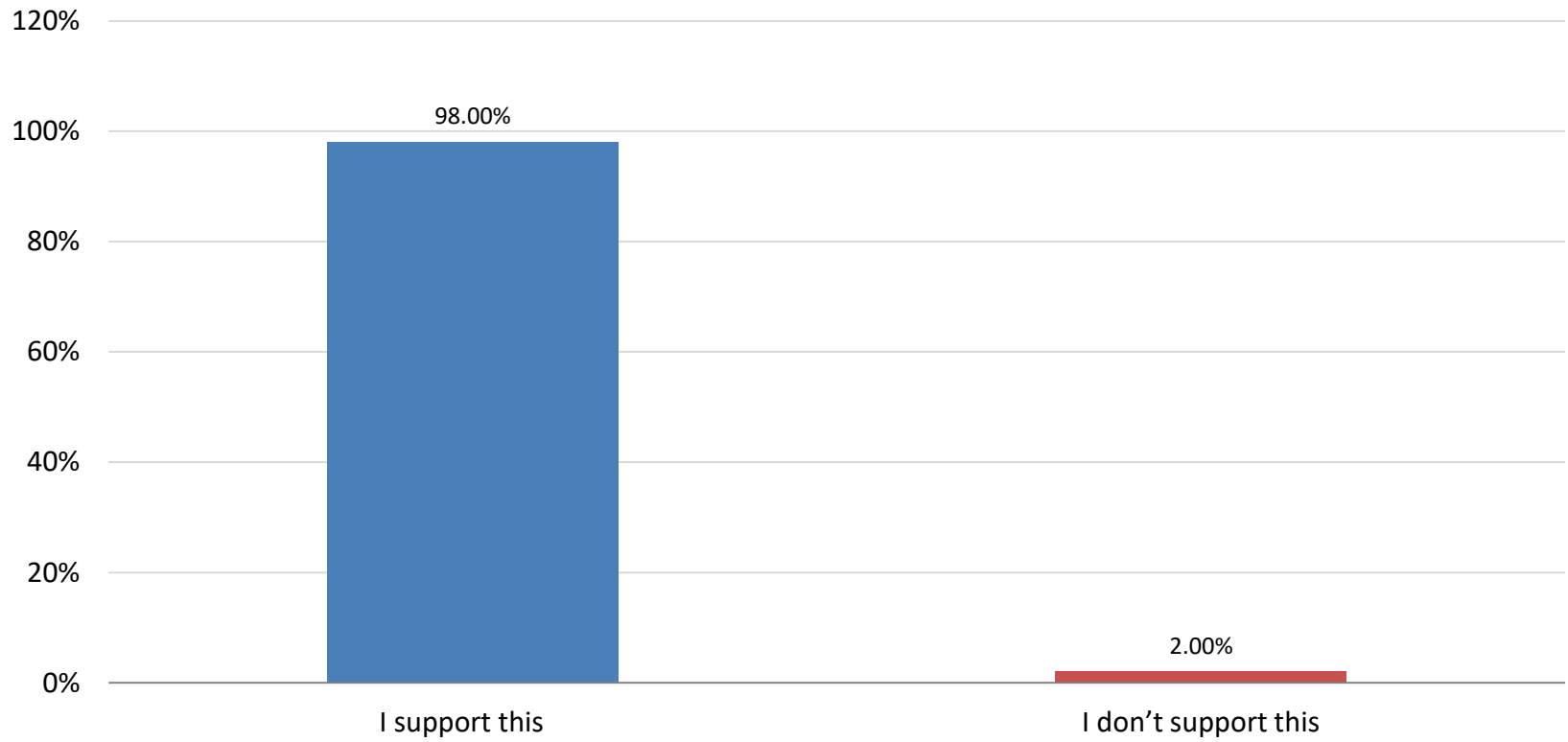
Playing loud music (likely to cause public annoyance)



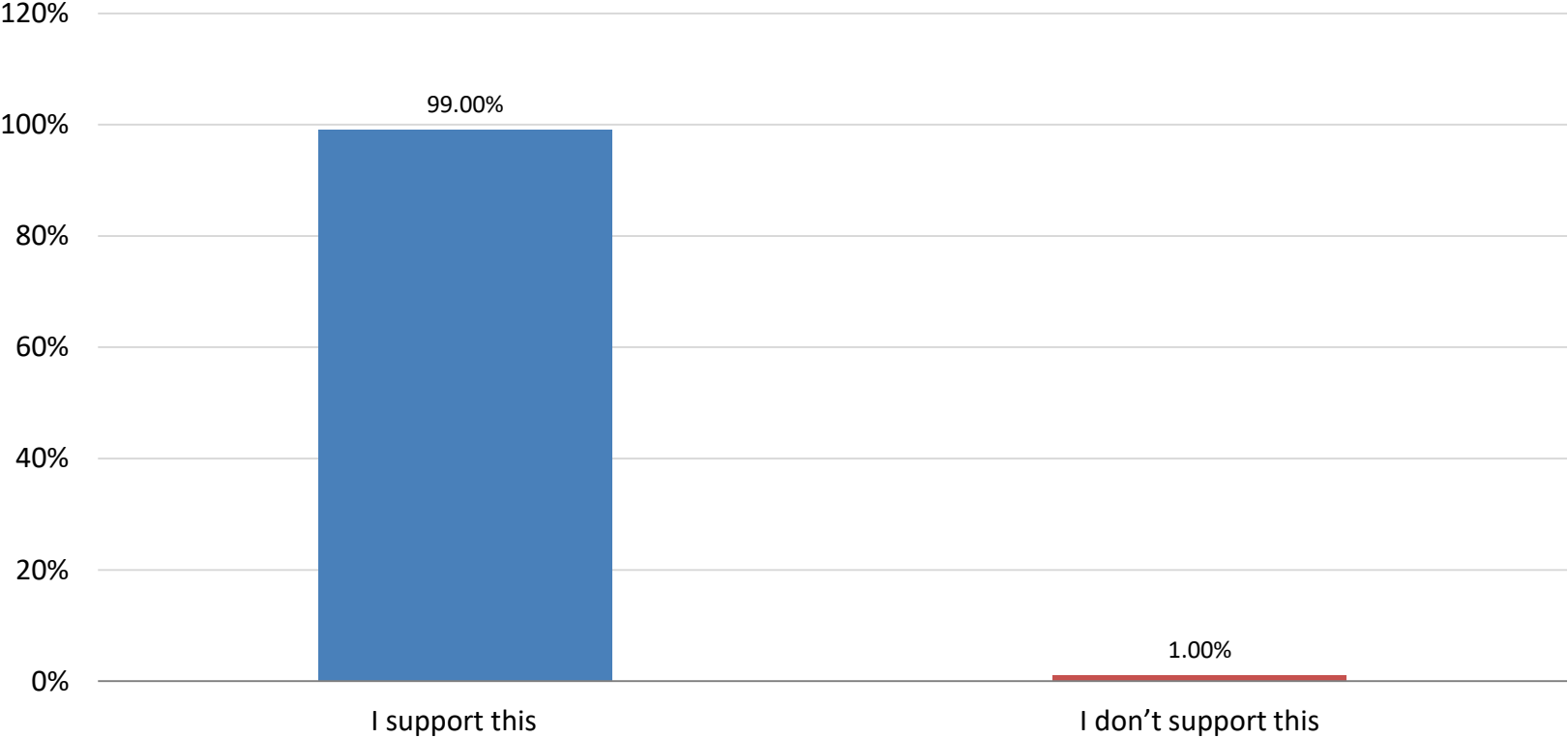
Creating excessive noise



Climbing onto any structure or building other than for a lawful purpose

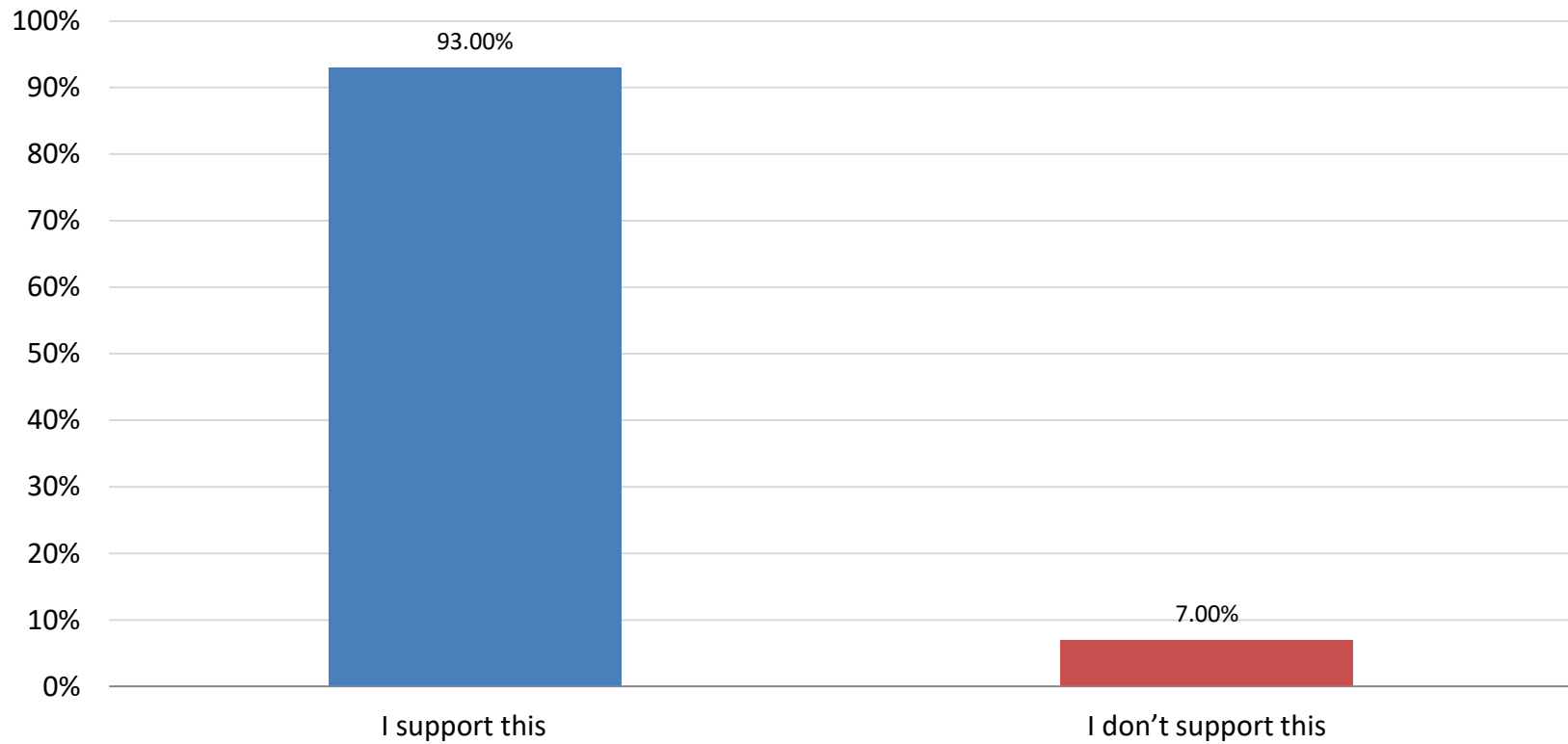


Behaving in a manner likely to cause damage or significant risk of damage to property

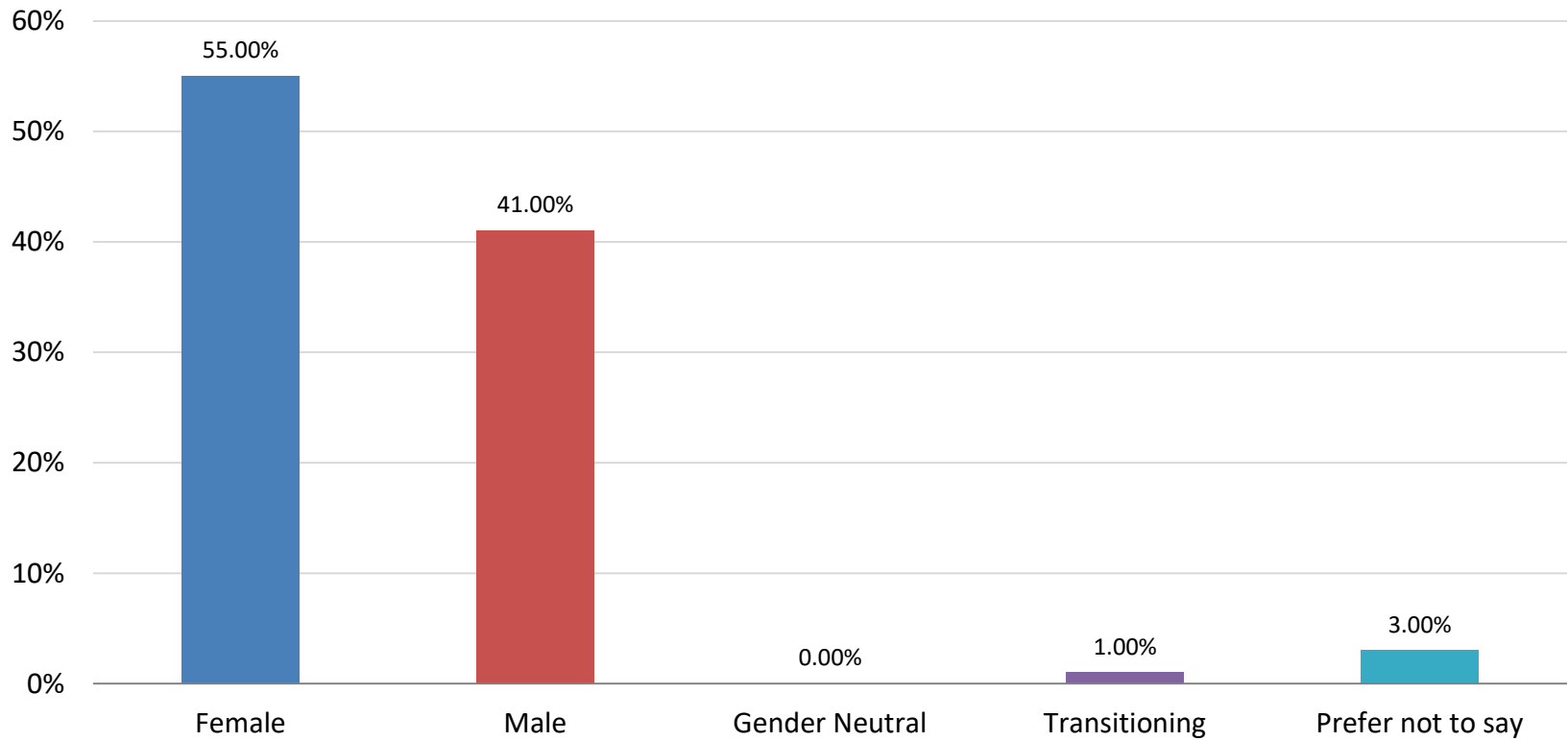

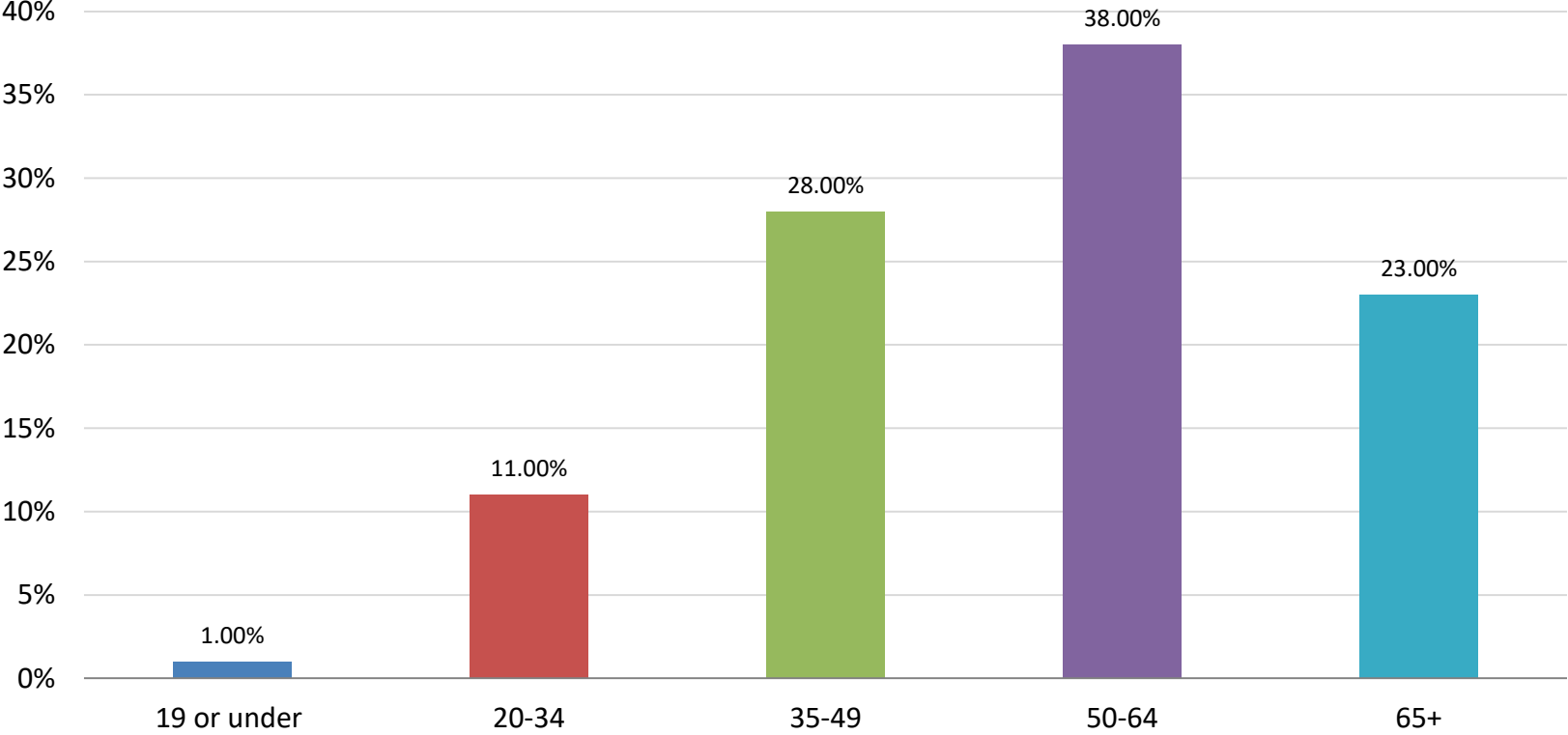
